

**FOURTH AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF
VENTURA AND HEALTHRIGHT 360**

This "Fourth Amendment" to the Agreement, dated July 1, 2023 for Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System Substance Use Disorder Services, is made and entered into by and between the **COUNTY OF VENTURA**, acting through its Ventura County Behavioral Health, a primary service provider, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY," and **HEALTHRIGHT 360**, hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR," individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively referred to as the "Parties."

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereby agree that effective March 18, 2025 the Agreement is amended as follows:

- I. COUNTY will pay CONTRACTOR two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$225,000) in a lump sum payment, representing payment for direct services rendered to patients during FY 2023-2024 in excess of the amount already paid for such services under the Agreement then in place between the Parties.
- II. Except for the modifications described herein, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement, as previously amended, shall remain in effect.
- III. The Parties hereto agree that this Fourth Amendment may be transmitted and signed by electronic or digital means by either/any or both/all parties and that such signatures shall have the same force and effect as original signatures, in accordance with California Government Code Section 16.5 and California Civil Code Section 1633.7.
