STATE PROPOSITIONS

(Requires approval by a simple majority of the voters)

PROPOSITION 2 – AUTHORIZES BONDS FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY COLLEGE FACILITIES. LEGISLATIVE STATUTE.

PROPOSITION 3 – CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHT TO MARRIAGE. LEGISLATIVE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

PROPOSITION 4 – AUTHORIZES BONDS FOR SAFE DRINKING WATER, WILDFIRE PREVENTION, AND PROTECTING COMMUNITIES AND NATURAL LANDS FROM CLIMATE RISKS. LEGISLATIVE STATUTE.

PROPOSITION 5 – ALLOWS LOCAL BONDS FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE WITH 55% VOTER APPROVAL. LEGISLATIVE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

PROPOSITION 6 – ELIMINATES CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISION ALLOWING INVOLUNTARY SERVITUDE FOR INCARCERATED PERSONS. LEGISLATIVE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

PROPOSITION 32 – RAISES MINIMUM WAGE. INITIATIVE STATUTE.

PROPOSITION 33 – EXPANDS LOCAL GOVERNMENTS' AUTHORITY TO ENACT RENT CONTROL ON RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY. INITIATIVE STATUTE.

PROPOSITION 34 – RESTRICTS SPENDING OF PRESCRIPTION DRUG REVENUES BY CERTAIN HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS. INITIATIVE STATUTE.

PROPOSITION 35 – PROVIDES PERMANENT FUNDING FOR MEDICAL HEALTH CARE SERVICES. INITIATIVE STATUTE.

PROPOSITION 36 – ALLOWS FELONY CHARGES AND INCREASES SENTENCES FOR CERTAIN DRUG AND THEFT CRIMES. INITIATIVE STATUTE.

LOCAL MEASURES

OXNARD UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT – MEASURE E

To improve the quality of education at local high schools; modernize/expand/construct career technical education facilities; make health, safety and security improvements; and replace HVAC and deteriorating plumbing/sewer systems; shall Oxnard Union High School District's measure be adopted authorizing \$285,000,000 of bonds at legal rates, generating on average \$21,780,000 annually while bonds are outstanding, with annual audits, citizens' oversight, all money staying local, at rates of approximately \$17.84 per \$100,000 assessed value, with no projected increase to existing tax rates?

BRIGGS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT – MEASURE G

To improve the quality of education; repair and replace leaky roofs, plumbing, electrical, and HVAC systems; modernize, upgrade, and renovate classrooms and restrooms; and update security and safety; shall the Briggs Elementary School District measure to issue \$4,900,000 of bonds at legal interest rates be adopted, generating on average \$314,000 annually while bonds are outstanding at rates of approximately \$30 per \$100,000 in assessed value, with strict accountability, including citizens oversight, annual audits, and all money staying local? **Supporters:** Charles Alvarez; Mindee Stekkinger; Jaime Magaña; Michael Nava **Opponents:** Ventura County Taxpayer Association

VENTURA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT – MEASURE H

To aid in preserving, improving and expanding academic programs including reading, writing, music, art, science and math; attract and retain qualified teachers; and maintain school mental health programs, shall Ventura Unified School District's measure be adopted renewing its existing parcel tax for eight years at the same rate of \$59 per parcel, raising approximately \$2.5 million annually, with independent citizens' oversight and all funds spent on local schools? **Supporters:** Matt LaVere, Ventura County Supervisor; Jeannette Sanchez-Palacios; Gerald Dannenberg, VUSD Governing Board Member; Carol R. RIVERPARK NO TAX INCREASE – MEASURE I

CITY-SPONSORED COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO.5 (RIVERPARK) NO TAX INCREASE, PUBLIC SAFETY, NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES MEASURE. Shall the City of Oxnard-sponsored measure to continue current funding for Community Facilities District No. 5 (RiverPark) and maintain community safety, enhance police protection, neighborhood/park patrols, keeping public areas clean, safe, well-maintained, including parks, open space; maintain flood protection, without any increase to the existing maximum tax rate, continuing ongoing public disclosure of spending and annual reports -- be adopted? **Supporters:** Charlotte Schneblen; Sandra Diaz; Glen Becerra; Ann Walsh; Oxnard Peace Officers Association **Opponents:** Daniel Wolkenfeld; Joe Esquivel, former Rio School District Trustee; Daniel Bautista; Keith Ostoja; Moving Oxnard Forward, Inc.

REPEAL OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES NO. 5 (RIVERPARK) SPECIAL TAXES

Shall an ordinance to repeal all special taxes specific to RiverPark (Community Facilities District No. 5), eliminating funding for extra police protection services, neighborhood/park patrols within RiverPark, eliminating funding for maintenance of RiverPark parks and open space, sports fields used for youth baseball and soccer, trails, dog parks at enhanced service levels, eliminating funding for landscaping maintenance, flood and storm protection services -- be adopted? **Supporters:** Daniel Wolkenfeld; Joe Esquivel, former Rio School District Trustee; Daniel Bautista; Keith Ostoja; Moving Oxnard Forward, Inc. **Opponents:** Ilana Stice; Gwynneth L. RIVERPARK LIMITATIONS – MEASURE L

LIMITATIONS ON USES OF SPECIAL TAXES FOR COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 5 (RIVERPARK) Shall an ordinance imposing limits on how Community Facilities District No. 5 (RiverPark) (CFD) funding is used - including limiting police protection services, reducing CFD funding available for flood and storm protection services, prohibiting using CFD funding to maintain sports fields for youth baseball and soccer, and limiting CFD funding for maintenance of parks, parkways and open space to beyond that of “standard municipal services” - be adopted? **Supporters:** Daniel Wolkenfeld; Joe Esquivel, former Rio School District Trustee; Daniel Bautista; Keith Ostoja; Moving Oxnard Forward, Inc. **Opponents:** Ilana Stice; Gwynneth L. SANTA PAULA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO.1 – MEASURE M

Middle School Modernization Bond. With no projected increase in current estimated tax rates, shall Santa Paula Unified School District’s measure to construct, upgrade and modernize elementary and middle school classrooms, libraries, cafeterias and restrooms be approved, authorizing \$28.4 million of bonds with average levies below \$34 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation while outstanding (approximately \$2.1 million annually), legal rates, citizen oversight, audits, full public disclosure of all spending and no funds taken by the State and spent elsewhere? **Supporters:** Gina Ramirez; Nancy Gonzalez **Opponents:** Ventura County Taxpayer Association

SANTA PAULA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT – MEASURE N

High School Modernization Bond. With funds that cannot be taken by the State and spent elsewhere, shall Santa Paula Unified School District’s measure to rebuild and upgrade Bryden Gym; construct performing arts, vocational/ career training facilities and a community pool be adopted, authorizing \$36 million of bonds with estimated average levies of \$24 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation (approximately \$2.1 million annually) while outstanding, legal rates, audits, citizen oversight, State matching funds eligibility and full disclosure of all spending? **Supporters:** Gina Ramirez; Nancy Gonzalez **Opponents:** Ventura County Taxpayer Association

THE OJAI PICKLEBALL ACT – MEASURE O

Pickleball Courts at Ojai City Hall. Shall the Charter be modernized with gender-neutral language and be amended in 16 sections to make various changes, including aligning teleconferencing options, notice of special meetings, the passing of emergency ordinances, and Council compensation with the Government Code, and establishing the duty for Council to consider a charter review commission? **Supporters:** None submitted **Opponents:** None submitted

VENTURA CITY COUNCIL VANCIES – MEASURE Q

FILLING OF VACANCIES CHARTER AMENDMENT

Shall Section 705 (c) of the Charter regarding City Council vacancies be revised to require the Council to appoint a person to fill a vacancy so that the person will serve as a councilmember until the next consolidated election in the County instead of requiring the Council to order a special election to fill a vacancy when the Council fails to fill the vacancy? **Supporters:** None submitted **Opponents:** None submitted

SANTA PAULA POTHoles – MEASURE R

City of Santa Paula Streets, Pothole Repair, City Services Measure. Shall the measure funding Santa Paula services such as accelerating repair of streets/potholes; preventing sinkholes; repairing sidewalks; maintaining 911 response; retaining local businesses; cleaning up public areas; maintaining storm drains/clean drinking water sources; offering youth programs; and for general government use by enacting a 1¢ sales tax providing approximately \$4,500,000 annually until ended by voters; requiring audits, public spending disclosure, all funds benefit Santa Paula residents, be adopted? **Supporters:** Dr. Maria Munguía; Alfonso Guilin; John Marquez; Connie Tushla **Opponents:** Ventura County Taxpayer Association
