



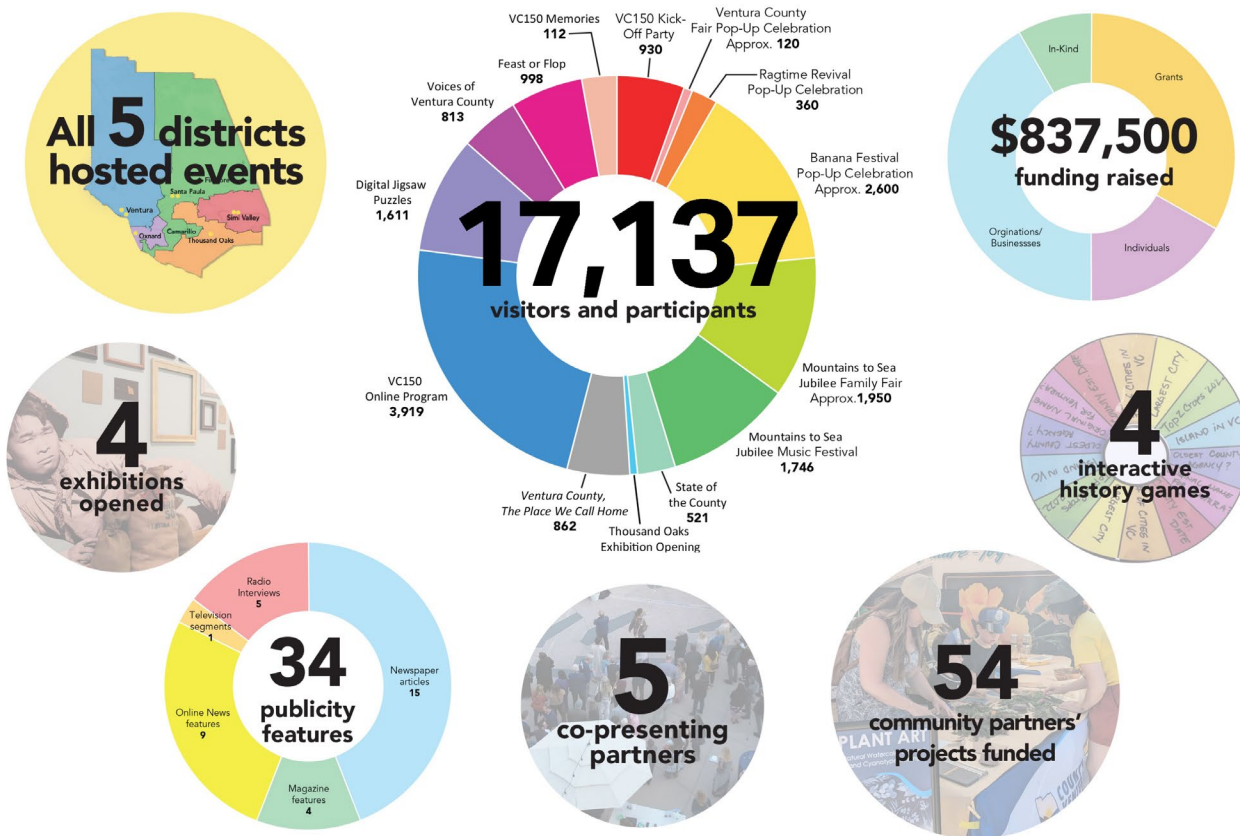

Ventura County, The Place We Call Home

Ventura County, The Place We Call Home is a photography exhibition curated by MVC's chief curator Carlos Ortega that highlights the diversity of the communities who call Ventura County home. The exhibition utilizes both historical and contemporary photographs to compare and contrast, over time, the lives of the people connected to Ventura County and their relationship to nature, the land, and each other.



Ventura County, The Place We Call Home first opened at the Santa Paula Agriculture Museum during the Mountains to Sea Jubilee Event on October 21, 2023. The exhibition is on view at three additional venues: the Bank of America Performing Arts Center Thousand Oaks, Oxnard College (Condor Hall), and the Rancho Simi Activity Center.

Mountains to Sea Jubilee Family Fair

October 21, 2023, 11am-3pm

The Mountains to Sea Jubilee Family Fair at and around Santa Paula's Agriculture Museum featured food trucks, a kids' zone, community stages, pumpkin patch, petting zoo, historical walking tours, arts and crafts stations, sheriffs, search and rescue dogs, historical enactors, performances, community workshops, information and trivia booths, and more.

Mountains to Sea Jubilee Music Festival

October 21, 2023, 12-8:30pm

The Mountains to Sea Jubilee Music Festival at Veteran's Park in Santa Paula featured musical acts Big Bad Voodoo Daddy, Mariachi Camarillo, Rey Fresco, Whiskey Business, and the Charles Law Band. Attendees were able to enjoy local food trucks, a beer and wine garden, and artisanal vendors.

Total attendance: 1,746



City of Santa Paula

City officials and staff, along with nonprofit organizations and volunteers, collaborated with the County, MVC, and other 150th partners, and led two efforts to welcome the festival.

Pre-Event Cleanup: Santa Paula Proud organized their annual Clean Up Day one week the event, attracting over 150 volunteers—double the usual attendance!

Bursting with Color: The Downtown Banner Celebration engaged Santa Paula artists of all ages, with 82 light pole banners displaying 150th-themed artwork along historic Main Street.

Welcome Banners for all 10 Cities: Light pole banners were placed downtown, welcoming each of the 10 cities to Santa Paula on the Jubilee weekend.

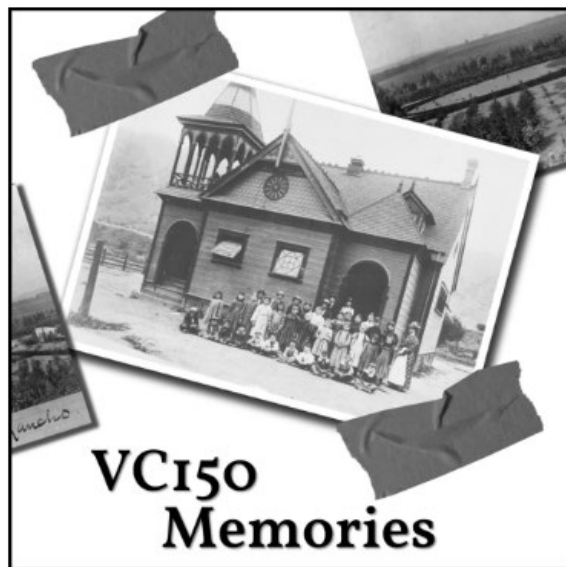

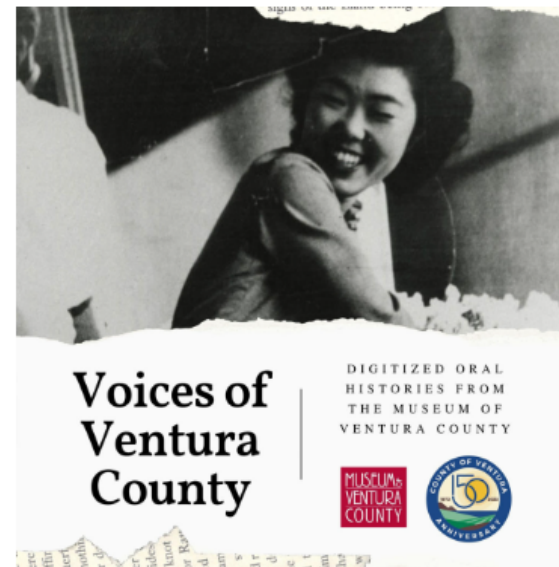
150th Feast or Flop

Voices of Ventura County

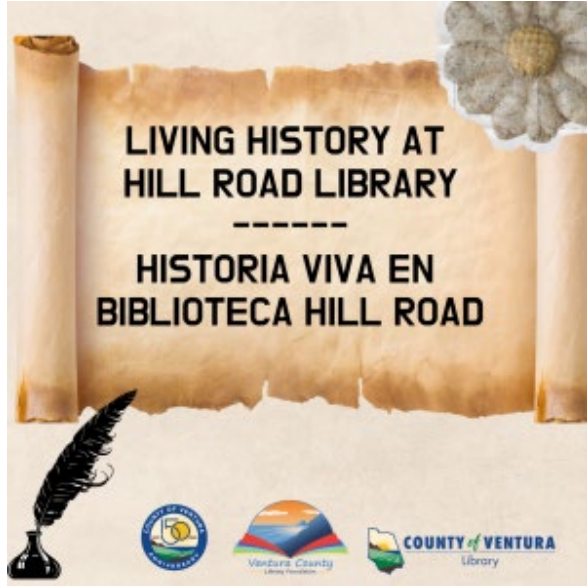
