SUBJECT: Public Hearing to Consider Adoption of County-Initiated Amendments to Articles 2 and 6 of the Ventura County Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance to Establish Setbacks from 16 Wildlife Crossing Structures Located in the Northern Portion of the Ventura County Unincorporated Area (Proposed Ordinance); Find the Approval of the Proposed Ordinance is Exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (Case No. PL19-0088, County Applicant); Supervisorial Districts 1 and 3.

RECOMMENDED ACTIONS:

- a. **CERTIFY** that your Board has reviewed and considered this Board letter and all exhibits hereto, the Planning Commission staff report and all exhibits thereto, and has considered all other materials and public comments received during the public comment and hearing process;
- b. **FIND**, on the basis of the entire record and as set forth in Section B of the Planning Commission staff report (Exhibit 1), that the adoption of the Proposed Ordinance amending Articles 2 and 6 of the Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance (NCZO) (Exhibit 4) is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the project may have a significant effect on the environment; **FIND** that because the Proposed Ordinance consists of regulations for the benefit and protection of natural resources and the environment, it is also exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15307 and 15308; and **FIND** that no substantial evidence exists precluding the use of the above categorical exemptions based on the presence of unusual circumstances or any other exception set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2;
- c. **FIND**, on the basis of the entire record and as set forth in Sections A, B, C and D of the Planning Commission staff report (Exhibit 1), that the Proposed Ordinance (Exhibit 4) is consistent with the Goals, Policies and Programs of the General Plan, and constitutes good planning practices and is in the interest of public health, safety and general welfare;

- d. **ADOPT** the Proposed Ordinance (Exhibit 4) amending Articles 2 and 6 of the NCZO; and
- e. **SPECIFY** the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is the custodian, and 800 S. Victoria Avenue, Ventura, CA 93009 is the location, of the documents and materials that constitute the record of proceedings upon which these decisions are based.

The Proposed Ordinance can be completed with existing Planning Division staff and within the existing Planning Division budget allocations. Implementing the recommended actions is expected to take an additional 115 hours of staff time and is included in the Planning Division’s FY 2022-2023 adopted budget. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Proposed Ordinance will improve safe passage for both wildlife and vehicles by establishing setbacks from 16 wildlife crossing structures along roadways in the northern Ventura County unincorporated area. In March 2019, the Board directed Planning staff to develop a project to establish an overlay zone for the purpose of regulating development near wildlife crossing structures on private property within the Los Padres National Forest

area. In developing the project, the Planning Division determined a setback approach would be a more effective and less complicated approach to protect the 16 wildlife crossing structures than establishing an overlay. As explained in more detail below, the Proposed Ordinance would prohibit certain new development, land uses and activities from occurring within a 200-foot setback area of the entry and exit points of 16 wildlife crossing structures. The Proposed Ordinance would not apply to existing development and includes 27 exemptions (discussed on pages 4-5) that balance private, public, and utility maintenance needs with the protection of the wildlife crossing structures.

The following sections of this Board letter provide: (1) a brief background and purpose of the Proposed Ordinance; (2) a summary of the Proposed Ordinance, (3) a summary of the recommendations received from the Planning Commission during the November 3, 2022, public hearing regarding the Proposed Ordinance; (4) a discussion regarding CEQA and the related finding that the Proposed Ordinance is exempt from environmental review; and (5) a summary of the public outreach efforts and public noticing of this Board item.

BACKGROUND:

On March 19, 2019, the Board directed Planning staff to create an overlay zone for the purpose of regulating development near wildlife crossing structures on private property within the Los Padres National Forest area. Planning staff, biologists, and colleagues within Caltrans and the National Park Service conducted a detailed review and analysis of the project area and determined that there are 16 wildlife crossing structures (SR Exhibit 10) that are highly functional for wildlife movement in the northern County unincorporated area.

Roads and highways have been documented to cause harmful effects on wildlife movement through the landscape¹. Animals entering roadways are often killed and pose a hazard to drivers, who may collide with the animal, or maneuver to try to avoid the animal and incur vehicle damage, injury, and even death². In a recent report released by the University of California Road Ecology Center, wildlife vehicle collisions cost the State of California an estimated \$2 billion between 2016 and 2020³. Studies have also found that the use of wildlife crossing structures significantly decrease the number of wildlife-

vehicle collisions^{4,5}. The protection of road crossing structures and the functional characteristics that encourage use by wildlife can help reduce vehicle/wildlife collisions as well as increase connectivity for wildlife movement through the landscape⁶.

Scientific studies reveal that wildlife use of culverts or bridges to cross highways is dependent upon characteristics such as light, openness, and accessibility of the structure, as well as the environmental conditions in the area outside structure entrances such as presence of vegetation, light, noise, human presence, etc. (Exhibit 1, SR Exhibit 10). This information was used as a basis for the Proposed Ordinance to minimize vegetation removal, restrict new development, and limit human disturbance activities within 200 feet of the entrances of the 16 identified wildlife crossing structures.

The wildlife crossing structures in the northern county unincorporated area will be protected most effectively through development setbacks, rather than an overlay zone due to the limited number of crossing structures, limited scale of the project planning area and the rural character of the northern unincorporated area. Additionally, as explained in more detail in the Planning Commission Staff Report (Exhibit 1, Section D), very few existing structures are located within the proposed 200-foot setback areas. Overall, the setback planning concept in the Proposed Ordinance provides an effective approach focused on the specific wildlife crossing structures than compared to an overlay zone that would regulate broader areas of private property.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE:

The Proposed Ordinance in legislative format is shown in Exhibit 3 and a clean version for official adoption is shown in Exhibit 4. The Proposed Ordinance consists of the following amendments to the NCZO:

(1) Amendments to Article 2 of the NCZO:

The definition of "wildlife crossing structure" is proposed to be amended to clarify that flood plain facilities may also be a barrier to wildlife connectivity, that wildlife crossing structures are used by both terrestrial and aquatic wildlife, and to reflect that an existing map layer within the County View Geographic Information System would be updated to include the locations of the 16 wildlife crossing structures that are subject of the Proposed Ordinance; and

(2) *Amendments to Article 6 of the NCZO:*

A new section is proposed to be included within the section for Miscellaneous Setback Regulations (Section 8106-6.5) titled “Wildlife Crossing Structures and Setback Areas (Northern Unincorporated Area)” where the 16 functional wildlife crossing structures are explicitly identified according to agency of ownership, identification numbers, and location (Section 8106-6.5.1). A description and diagrams are also provided to clarify how the 200-foot setback area would be measured from the culvert or bridge (Section 8106-6.5.4).

The regulations for the setback areas (Section 8106-6.5.4) would only apply to certain new development, structures, land uses, and activities constructed or occurring after the effective date of the ordinance (Section 8106-6.5.2), unless exempt (Section 8106-6.5.3) or otherwise allowed for existing structure expansions (Section 8106-6.5.5), as specified in the Proposed Ordinance. There are 27 exemptions organized in three categories: “vegetation modification”, “structures, development, land uses, and activities”, and “outdoor lighting and related activities”. The exemptions intend to balance private property interests with maintaining suitable conditions around the entrance of the crossing structures to minimize vegetation loss and disturbance for continued use by wildlife. For example, some of the following types of activities or development would be exempt from the Proposed Ordinance: public agency or utility company infrastructure maintenance activities; fuel modification activities for fire safety; activities associated with planting or maintaining commercial crops/orchards or associated roads; maintenance and repair activities for legally established structures/fences; rebuilding after natural disasters, as specified; surface mining operations authorized by an approved conditional use permit; or the replacement of essential lighting when utilizing the minimum output necessary for safety and security purposes. For more detailed background and discussion of each NCZO text amendment, including the exemptions, please see the November 3, 2022, Planning Commission staff report (Exhibit 1, Section A.5).

PLANNING COMMISSION HEARING:

The Proposed Ordinance was presented to the Planning Commission on November 3, 2022. The Planning Commission staff report, errata memorandum and the associated exhibits from the hearing are included hereto as Exhibit 1. The Planning Commission voted 5-0 to approve staff’s recommendations, including a recommendation that your Board adopt the Proposed Ordinance. The Planning Commission’s resolution regarding the project is attached as Exhibit 2.

After the Planning Commission hearing, staff identified a typographical error in Section 8106-6.5.5 of the Proposed Ordinance. As explained in staff’s explanations in Exhibit 3, Section 8106-6.5.5 addresses situations when property owners may wish to expand or enlarge an existing structure that is rendered nonconforming by Section 8106-6.5. Section 8106-6.5.5 is intended to allow for a structure to be enlarged if the expansion is either located outside the setback area or does not increase the footprint of the nonconforming structure (e.g., the property owner builds up rather than out), provided that the expansion does not increase any non-conformity with the prohibitions set forth in Section 8106-6.5.2,

subdivisions (c) through (g) (e.g., prohibitions against certain wildlife impermeable fencing, vegetation modification, landscape areas, outdoor lighting, and indoor luminaires). The version of the Proposed Ordinance presented to the Planning Commission mistakenly referred to subdivisions (c) through (d) of Section 8106-6.5.2, rather than subdivisions (c) through (g) (SR Exhibits 3 and 4). Staff has corrected this error in the Proposed Ordinance (Exhibits 3 and 4).

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW:

The Proposed Ordinance is exempt from environmental review pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15061(b)(3), 15307 and 15308. The Proposed Ordinance is exempt pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility the Proposed Ordinance may cause a significant effect on the environment. The Proposed Ordinance is also categorically exempt pursuant to CEQA Guidelines, Sections 15307 (Class 7) and 15308 (Class 8) as a regulatory action to assure the maintenance and protection of the environment. Furthermore, no unusual circumstances or other exception set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 would preclude application of the Class 7 and Class 8 exemptions.

The Proposed Ordinance's effects on the environment will be beneficial since it will increase protections for biological and other environmental resources, maintain the functional nature of identified important wildlife crossings to help prevent wildlife mortality and help increase wildlife connectivity within the landscape. Increased landscape connectivity promotes genetic diversity among wildlife populations and is beneficial to threatened or endangered species. In addition, increased landscape connectivity also allows wildlife populations to move across the landscape when experiencing environmental stressors such as drought, fire, or other changes in climate. Additionally, the Proposed Ordinance may also indirectly help protect water quality associated with the stream/river areas that intersect the crossing structures by reducing erosion, soil disturbance, and impervious surface area due to the setbacks imposed on certain future development.

PUBLIC NOTICE AND OUTREACH:

On September 21, 2022, at 5:30 p.m. the Planning Division held an informational webinar on Zoom regarding the Proposed Ordinance. Post card notices were sent over two weeks before the meeting to 27 property owners within a 300-foot radius of the 16 proposed wildlife crossing structures, as well as to various stakeholder groups such as the Ventura County Coalition of Labor, Agriculture and Business (CoLab) and Los Padres ForestWatch. A total of six participants joined the September 21, 2022, meeting webinar.

Public notice regarding the Planning Commission hearing was provided in accordance with Government Code section 65091 and NCZO Section 8111-3.1. The Planning Division also placed a legal advertisement that was published in the *Ventura County Star* and the *Mountain Enterprise* in Frazier Park on October 21, 2022. In addition, on October 21, 2022, a postcard notice for the hearing was mailed to property owners within 300 feet of the proposed wildlife crossing structures.

A public notice for this Board hearing was published, along with a summary of the text amendments, in the *Ventura County Star* on November 23, 2022 and the *Mountain Enterprise* in Frazier Park on November 25, 2022. On November 23, 2022, another postcard notice was mailed to property owners within 300 feet of the proposed wildlife crossing structure setbacks. An email notice was also sent to interested parties who requested to receive updates. Planning staff also met with property owners through video conferences, phone calls, and emails to answer questions or work to address concerns associated with the proposed ordinance. Exhibit 5 contains public comments received by the Planning Division after the November 3rd 2022 Planning Commission hearing.

RESOLUTION 22-30 FOR PL19-0088 REGARDING PROPOSED COUNTY-INITIATED ORDINANCE AMENDING THE VENTURA COUNTY NON-COASTAL ZONING ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH SETBACKS FROM 16 WILDLIFE CROSSING STRUCTURES IN THE NORTHERN PORTION OF THE COUNTY UNINCORPORATED AREA; AND RELATED FINDING THAT THE PROJECT IS EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT

WHEREAS, on November 3, 2022, the Ventura County Planning Commission ("Commission") held a legally noticed public hearing to consider a county-initiated ordinance amending Articles 2 and 6 of the Ventura County Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance (NCZO) to establish setbacks from 16 wildlife crossing structures in the northern portion of the Ventura County unincorporated area (Proposed Ordinance); and to consider a finding that the project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA);

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission reviewed the staff report and all the exhibits, considered all oral and written testimony from the general public and County staff, and considered all comments received during the public comment and hearing process;

WHEREAS, after the close of the public hearing, Commissioner King, made a motion to approve staff's recommended actions, with the direction for the Planning Division to incorporate the applicable revisions set forth in the Planning Division's November 2, 2022 errata memorandum to the Planning Commission (Exhibit 12) ¹, seconded by Planning Commissioner Aidukas;

WHEREAS, the motion carried 5-0; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Planning Commission recommends that the following actions be taken by the Board of Supervisors with respect to the Proposed Ordinance:

1. **CERTIFY** that the Board has reviewed and considered the Board letter and all exhibits thereto, the Planning Commission staff report and all exhibits thereto, and has considered all other materials and public comments received during the public comment and hearing processes;
2. **FIND**, on the basis of the entire record and as set forth in Section B of the Planning Commission staff report that the adoption of the Proposed Ordinance amending Articles 2 and 6 of the Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance

(Exhibit 4) is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility the project may cause a significant effect on the environment; **FIND** that because the project consists of regulations for the benefit and protection of natural resources and the environment, it is also exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15307 and 15308; and **FIND** that no substantial evidence exists precluding the use of the above categorical exemptions based on the presence of unusual circumstances or any other exception set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2;

3. **FIND**, on the basis of the entire record and as set forth in Sections A, B, C and D of the Planning Commission staff report, the Proposed Ordinance (Exhibit 4) is consistent with the goals, policies and programs of the Ventura County General Plan and good planning practices and is in the interest of public health, safety and general welfare;
4. **ADOPT** the Proposed Ordinance (Exhibit 4) amending Articles 2 and 6 of the Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance, as modified to incorporate the applicable revisions set forth in the Planning Division's November 2, 2022, errata memorandum to the Planning Commission (Exhibit 12); and
5. **SPECIFY** that the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is the custodian, and 800 S. Victoria Avenue, Ventura, CA 93009 is the location, of the documents and materials that constitute the record of proceedings upon which these decisions are based.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Planning Commission's reasons for the above-stated recommendations to the Board, and the relationship between the Proposed Ordinance and the General Plan, are specified in Sections A, B, and C of the Planning Commission staff report and exhibits thereto. As a general summary, the Proposed Ordinance would establish 200-foot setbacks from 16 road crossing structures identified as highly functional wildlife crossing structures in the northern Ventura County unincorporated area (Exhibit 10). The Planning Commission finds that the Proposed Ordinance furthers the purposes of biological resource protection, while also allowing reasonable development and enjoyment of property. The Proposed Ordinance is consistent with the General Plan and helps further various policy objectives that seek to minimize impacts to wildlife movement, facilitate wildlife passage, and preserve open space. The Proposed Ordinance also helps to reduce collisions between vehicles and wildlife by facilitating the use of wildlife crossing structures.

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF VENTURA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA
AMENDING DIVISION 8, CHAPTER 1, ARTICLES 2 AND 6 OF THE VENTURA
COUNTY ORDINANCE CODE, NON-COASTAL ZONING ORDINANCE TO
ESTABLISH SETBACKS FROM 16 WILDLIFE CROSSING STRUCTURES LOCATED
IN THE NORTHERN PORTION OF THE VENTURA COUNTY UNINCORPORATED
AREA**

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Ventura (“County”) ordains as follows:

Section 1

**ARTICLE 2:
DEFINITIONS**

Article 2, Section 8102-0 – Application of Definitions, of the Ventura County Ordinance Code is hereby amended by revising the following existing definition to read as follows:

Wildlife Crossing Structure—A *structure* (such as a culvert, bridge or underpass) containing features that enhance its suitability for use by wildlife (terrestrial or aquatic) to safely cross human-made barriers (such as flood plain facilities, roadways and highways). Examples of such features include the presence of *vegetation* providing cover or habitat near the entrances and/or natural light visible at the opposite entrance. The locations of the *wildlife crossing structures* are shown on the “Wildlife Crossing Structures” map layer within the ~~Planning GIS Wildlife Corridor and Wildlife Crossing Structure Overlay Zone layer of the County of Ventura, Resource Management Agency, County View Geographic Information System (GIS), as may be amended by the *Planning Director*. The term definition of wildlife crossing structures does not include cattle guards.~~

[Staff Explanation: In addition to roadways and highways, flood plain facilities can also be a barrier to wildlife connectivity depending upon their location and design. The wildlife crossing structures that would be subject to the proposed setbacks are located exclusively in the northern portion of the Ventura County unincorporated area. The wildlife crossing structures identified in Section 8106-6.5.1 of the Proposed Ordinance would be added to an existing map layer in the County View GIS. The current map layer includes wildlife crossing structures that are located within the Habitat Connectivity and Wildlife Corridors (HCWC) and Critical Wildlife Passage Areas (CWPA) overlay zones, which are subject to the regulations set forth in Sections 8109-4.8 and 8109-4.9. The Proposed Ordinance makes no changes to the HCWC and CWPA overlays, no changes to the wildlife crossing structures located within the HCWC and CWPA overlays, and no changes to the regulations applicable to wildlife crossing structures in the HCWC and CWPA overlays. Changes to the definition of “wildlife crossing structure” are proposed to reflect the addition of the 16 wildlife crossing structures identified in Section 8106-6.5.1 to the map layer in the County GIS in addition to a few other minor grammatical non-substantive changes.]

Section 2

ARTICLE 6:

**LOT AREA AND COVERAGE, SETBACKS, HEIGHT
AND RELATED PROVISIONS**

Article 6, Sec. 8106-6.5 within Sec. 8106-6 – Miscellaneous Setback Regulations is hereby added to the Ventura County Ordinance Code to read as follows:

Section 8106-6.5 – Wildlife Crossing Structures and Setback Areas (Northern Unincorporated Area)

The purpose of this Section 8106-6.5 is to establish setbacks for certain development, land uses, and activities adjacent to *wildlife crossing structures* in the northern portion of the Ventura County unincorporated area to improve *functional connectivity* for terrestrial and aquatic wildlife across road barriers in the landscape by preserving vegetation cover and minimizing disturbances immediately adjacent to the entry and exit points of *wildlife crossing structures*.

[Staff Explanation: The new section states the purpose of the regulations and describes the establishment of setbacks to improve the function of the identified wildlife crossing structures.]

Section 8106-6.5.1 – Wildlife Crossing Structures

The regulations within this Section 8106-6.5 shall apply to *wildlife crossing structures* identified in Tables 1 and 2 (below), and the 200-foot setback area set forth in Section 8106-6.5.4.

[Staff Explanation: Section 8106-6.5.1 identifies the 16 wildlife crossing structures that would be subject to proposed setback regulations. The wildlife crossing structures identified in Tables 1 and 2 are all located in the northern portion of the Ventura County unincorporated area and are maintained by either the County or Caltrans. Six of the 16 wildlife crossing structures that would be subject to the proposed setback regulations are maintained by the County and the remaining ten are maintained by Caltrans.]

Sec. 8106-6.5.2 – Prohibited Development, Structures, Land Uses and Activities

Unless otherwise exempt by Section 8106-6.5.3, or excepted pursuant to Section 8106-6.5.5, the following types of new development, *structures*, land uses, and activities constructed or occurring after [the effective date of these amendments] shall be prohibited from occurring within the 200-foot setback area described in Section 8106-6.5.4 of any *wildlife crossing structure* identified in Tables 1 and 2 of Section 8106-6.5.1 above.

- a. Any new *structure*, land use, or activity that requires a Zoning Clearance or other permit under Article 5, including any associated new *fuel modification* authorized or required by the Ventura County Fire Protection District.
- b. Any expansion or enlargement of an existing *structure* that requires a permit under Article 5, including any associated new *fuel modification* authorized or required by the Ventura County Fire Protection District.
- c. New or replacement *wildlife impermeable fencing* within the bank or bed of a stream or river.
- d. Any *vegetation modification*.
- e. New or modified *landscape areas*.
- f. New or replacement *outdoor lighting*.
- g. New indoor *luminaires* within translucent or transparent enclosed structures for agricultural operations.

[Staff Explanation: This section 8106-6.5.2 would prohibit certain future development, structures, land uses, and activities from occurring within the 200-foot setback area of a wildlife crossing structure as described in Section 8106-6.5.1. By prohibiting certain development, structures, land uses, and activities from occurring within the setback area, the proposed regulations will help to enhance vegetation cover and minimize disturbances to increase wildlife use and improve the functionality of wildlife crossing structures.]

Section 8106-6.5.3 – General Exemptions

The following types of development, land uses, *structures* and activities are not subject to Section 8106-6.5.

a. Vegetation modification that is:

- (1) Required to comply with any federal or state law, or requirement of any permit, approval or order issued by a federal or state agency.
- (2) Carried out as part of a habitat preservation, restoration or enhancement project when specified by an agency approved mitigation plan, habitat conservation plan, or similar plan.
- (3) Conducted by a *conservation organization* for the purpose of maintaining or enhancing biological habitat or wildlife movement.
- (4) Reasonably required to maintain, repair or replace existing transportation, utility, and public safety infrastructure performed by a public agency or contracted designee. Examples include roads, bridges, pipelines, utility lines, flood control improvements, and drainage and utility ditches.
- (5) Performed by a public agency on publicly owned or maintained property.
- (6) Associated exclusively with vegetation that has been intentionally planted within a *landscape area*.
- (7) Conducted in accordance with one or more of the following: (i) as required or authorized by the Ventura County Fire Protection District (VCFPD) pursuant to VCFPD Fire Code, as may be amended; (ii) pursuant to a Community Wildfire Protection Plan or similar *fuel modification/wildfire protection plan* adopted and/or amended by VCFPD; or (iii) pursuant to a burn permit approved by VCFPD.
- (8) Conducted to construct or maintain a driveway or road internal to a legal lot that is utilized to plant or harvest a crop or orchard that will be commercially sold.

b. The following *structures*, development, land uses, and activities:

- (1) Repair or maintenance of an existing, legally established *structure* or fence.
- (2) The installation of *wildlife impermeable fencing* that is required to comply with any federal or state law, or any condition or requirement of any permit, approval or order issued by a federal or state agency.
- (3) *Structures* involuntarily damaged or destroyed by fire, flood, landslide, or natural disaster rebuilt to their original state and in their original location if (i) less than 50 percent of the *structure* is damaged or destroyed and (ii) a complete building permit application is submitted to the County within three years of the date that the damage occurred, and the permit once approved is diligently pursued to completion prior to expiration. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Chapter, the rebuilding of *structures* following fire, flood, landslide or natural disaster not meeting the above requirements shall comply with the requirements of this Section 8106-6.5.
- (4) Land, *fences*, or improvements other than *structures* involuntarily damaged or destroyed by fire, flood, landslide, or natural disaster restored or rebuilt to their

original state and in their original location if a complete building permit application is submitted to the County within three years of the date that the damage occurred, and the permit once approved is diligently pursued to completion prior to expiration, or if no permit is required, the rebuilding commences within the aforementioned three-year period and is diligently pursued to completion. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Chapter, the restoration of land, or rebuilding of fences, or improvements following fire, flood, landslide or natural disaster not meeting the above requirements shall comply with the requirements of this Section 8106-6.5.

- (5) Structures, wildlife impermeable fencing or improvements that are temporary, or are located entirely or substantially underground (e.g., pipelines, cables, individual sewage disposal systems). Pools are considered to be in-ground, not underground and do not qualify for this exemption.
 - (6) Planting or harvesting of crops or orchards that will be commercially sold.
 - (7) Livestock grazing.
 - (8) Bee hives used for apiculture activities.
 - (9) Surface mining operations, including but not limited to associated structures, fuel modification, fencing and lighting, that are authorized by an approved conditional use permit.
 - (10) Structures, development, land uses and activities which are protected by vested right or to the minimum extent necessary to avoid a constitutional taking of property, provided they comply with the following to the maximum extent feasible: (1) are sited the furthest distance from the entry or exit points of a wildlife crossing structure; and (2) any outdoor lighting is fully-shielded, directed downward, and maintained in such a manner to avoid light trespass beyond the bank of a stream or river. If light trespass occurs beyond the bank of a stream or river, the lighting shall be operated by motion sensor or a timer switch and shall be programmed to turn off no more than five minutes after activation.
- c. The following outdoor lighting and related activities:
- (1) Temporary lighting for road and utility construction.
 - (2) Temporary emergency lighting.
 - (3) Temporary lighting associated with a use authorized by this Chapter or a permit granted pursuant to this Chapter.
 - (4) Temporary or intermittent outdoor night lighting necessary to conduct agricultural activities including outdoor lighting used during weather events such as frosts, and temporary or intermittent outdoor night lighting used for oil and gas exploration and production regardless of the location or number of lights used. As used in this Section 8106-6.5.3, the term "intermittent" means a period of between 31 and 90 calendar days within any 12- month period. For example, the use of intermittent lighting in cases where it is used simultaneously to illuminate multiple, discreet facilities (well sites, multiple tanks, etc.) is not limited provided that each individual location is illuminated no longer than 90 calendar days within any 12-month period.
 - (5) Seasonal or festive lighting.
 - (6) Outdoor lighting with a maximum output of 60 lumens or less that is fully shielded and directed downward, including solar lights.
 - (7) Outdoor lighting on public and private streets.

- (8) Outdoor lighting used for any facility, equipment, or activity that is required to comply with any federal or state law, or any condition or requirement of any permit, approval or order issued by a federal or state agency.
- (9) Replacement of outdoor essential luminaires for existing legally permitted structures that utilize the minimum output necessary for safety and security purposes, with a correlated color temperature of 2700 Kelvin or less, that are directed downward and fully shielded to the maximum extent possible, and controlled by a motion detector and timer that are programmed to turn off no more than five minutes after activation.


[Staff Explanation: Section 8106-6.5.3 exempts certain development, land uses and activities from the proposed setback regulations to accommodate, among other things, public health and safety and the reasonable use of one’s property; the proposed exemptions help ensure that the proposed setback regulations will improve the functionality of crossing structures without compromising public safety or unduly burdening property interests.]

Section 8106-6.5.4 – Wildlife Crossing Structure Setback Area

The 200-foot-setback area surrounds the entry and exit point of each identified wildlife crossing structure and shall be measured as follows:


- a. The setback for culverts that span less than or equal to 10 feet in diameter or width shall be measured from the center of the entry and exit point, as shown in the diagram below;

- b. The setback for bridge structures and culverts with widths or diameters greater than 10 feet, shall be measured from the outside perimeter of the opening, as shown by the red arrows in the diagram below.

[Staff Explanation: How the 200-foot setback area is measured depends on whether it is a small culvert (10 foot diameter or less) or a large bridge or culvert. For wide bridges and culverts (i.e., those larger than 10 feet in diameter or width), if the setback is measured from the center of the structure, it may not be of suitable size to buffer disturbances or contain enough vegetative cover for wildlife to feel comfortable enough to utilize the crossing structure. Section 8106-6.5.4 takes this into account by specifying that the measurement is either from the center of the entry and exit points, or from the outside perimeter, of the crossing structure, depending on the diameter/width of the wildlife crossing structure.]

Section 8106-6.5.5 – Nonconforming Structures

Section 8113-1 shall apply to nonconforming structures located partially or wholly within the 200-foot setback area that existed as of [effective date of these amendments]. For purposes of Section 8113-1, an expansion or enlargement of a nonconforming structure shall be deemed in conformance with this Section 8106-6.5 if the expansion or enlargement, including any associated new fuel modification, is located completely outside of the 200-foot setback area or does not increase the footprint of the nonconforming structure, provided that the expansion does not increase any nonconformity with the prohibitions set forth in Section 8106-6.5.2, subdivisions (c) through (g).

[Staff Explanation: Section 8106-6.5.5 addresses situations when property owners may wish to expand or enlarge an existing structure that is rendered nonconforming by Section 8106-6.5. This section would allow for a structure to be enlarged if the expansion is either located outside the setback area or does not increase the footprint of the nonconforming structure (e.g., the property owner builds up rather than out), provided that the expansion does not increase any nonconformity with the prohibitions set forth in Section 8106-6.5.2, subdivisions (c) through (g) (e.g., prohibitions against certain wildlife impermeable fencing, vegetation modification, landscape areas, outdoor lighting, and indoor luminaires).]

Section 3

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, word or provision of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The

Ventura County Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed and adopted this ordinance, and each and all provisions hereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more provisions may be deemed invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 4

This ordinance shall become effective and operative 30 days after adoption.



- (8) *Outdoor lighting* used for any facility, equipment, or activity that is required to comply with any federal or state law, or any condition or requirement of any permit, approval or order issued by a federal or state agency.
- (9) Replacement of outdoor *essential luminaires* for existing legally permitted *structures* that utilize the minimum output necessary for safety and security purposes, with a *correlated color temperature* of 2700 *Kelvin* or less, that are directed downward and *fully shielded* to the maximum extent possible, and controlled by a motion detector and timer that are programmed to turn off no more than five minutes after activation.

Section 8106-6.5.4 – Wildlife Crossing Structure Setback Area


The 200-foot-setback area surrounds the entry and exit point of each identified *wildlife crossing structure* and shall be measured as follows:

- a. The setback for culverts that span less than or equal to 10 feet in diameter or width shall be measured from the center of the entry and exit point, as shown in the diagram below;

- b. The setback for bridge *structures* and culverts with widths or diameters greater than 10 feet, shall be measured from the outside perimeter of the opening, as shown by the red arrows in the diagram below.



Section 8106-6.5.5 – Nonconforming Structures

Section 8113-1 shall apply to nonconforming *structures* located partially or wholly within the 200-foot setback area that existed as of [effective date of these amendments]. For purposes of Section 8113-1, an expansion or enlargement of a nonconforming *structure* shall be deemed in conformance with this Section 8106-6.5 if the expansion or enlargement, including any associated new *fuel modification*, is located completely outside of the 200-foot setback area or does not increase the footprint of the nonconforming structure, provided that the expansion does not increase any nonconformity with the prohibitions set forth in Section 8106-6.5.2, subdivisions (c) through (g).

This Comment letter is in reference to proposed Amendments to Articles 2 and 6 of the Ventura County Zoning Ordinance to establish setbacks from 16 bridges deemed to be wildlife crossing structures in the North County. Specifically this letter is a request to pull/omit crossing 52 0067 from the list of effected bridges, or reduce the 200 'proposed regulation setback to 75 'for 16825 Maricopa Hwy, APN 0090060070.

The regulation and it's limitations unfairly impact this property, and we request relief from strict application of this regulation to alleviate an unusual hardship to this particular property, one that is not shared equally with neighboring properties, and not a self-created hardship. Here are several rationale for why this proposed regulation is an undo hardship burdening this property:

1. The neighboring property across the street, 16840 Maricopa Hwy, has a topography situation similar to 16825, in that there is very limited buildable land and that property's only buildable area is almost completely within the 200 foot crossing setback. By right, that property would be exempt from the limitations imposed by this proposed regulation because a primary residence on a legal buildable lot would always be an owner's right. It makes no sense that 16840 would be allowed an exemption to the proposed regulation at the same crossing and within the same setback limits to build a structure just a stone's throw across the road, while 16825 would still be held to its strict interpretation and no construction allowed on very valuable and scarce 'flat 'land.
2. Looking at the surrounding ownership of the lands near this crossing, the south side (downstream) of the waterway is generally privately owned in this specific area, and is a 'neighborhood 'of relatively dense maintained yards and houses. But the north and east areas slightly upstream are public lands, (national forest). It appears that animals could cross under the highway and easily continue on their way to the open, public lands without stepping foot on either 16825 or 16840. Neither property would cause any significant obstruction. In other words, animals do not need to cross or go near 16825 in this area to get to their linked open spaces. The far side of the river is all public land on both sides of the bridge. Crossing the 16825 property would only serve as a longer route to the same destination, the hillsides the the west and north.
3. Most importantly, the way the regulation is written, there is a significant number of exemptions allowed for all kinds of commercial activities and land uses. If one would want to build or modify the land in the 200 foot zone, it is possible to find an exemption to 'work around 'the regulation. This completely misses the spirit and value of the regulation in the first place. We see the value of providing animals safe passage across the road, but the broad exemptions make this regulation more of a gesture than an effective tool in animals 'interest. Because we not intend to utilize the property for commercial use, we are being penalized for actually trying to limit our footprint on the property by forcing additional restrictions on top of our own self imposed intentions to

limit development. In other words, a rancher/farmer could utilize every bit of this property for AG ventures with little to no accommodation for this regulation, but we, keeping a much lower profile and footprint on the land, are penalized with the full force of this regulation.

In conclusion, it seems clear this property warrants a serious look at being excluded from the unfair burdens placed upon it by pulling the adjacent crossing from the regulation, or by reducing the setback to 75 'which would still afford a buffer area for wildlife while still allowing for an unencumbered entrance to the property and a structure near that entrance. Along with considering a general exclusion or setback adjustment, we are open to discussing compensation for the loss of rights for the portion of the land effected by the proposed regulation, and if necessary, would work with Graham Lyons of Mullen & Henzell LLP to reach such an agreement with the County. We are looking at our relationship with the County as a partnership, and we truly believe that there are regulations that can be of use towards the greater good. We are willing to compromise and give up certain freedoms towards this ideal, but as with any relationship, we expect the County to also show some flexibility, and to see that it's a win/win if both parties can show they can give up something to reach agreement.

Honorable Chair Lavere and Supervisors:

The Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority (MRCA) expresses its strong support for the proposed amendments to Articles 2 and 6 of the Ventura County Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance to establish setbacks from 16 Ventura County (County) staff identified wildlife crossing structures in the northern portion of the County’s unincorporated area.

Habitat connectivity cannot realistically ever be replaced once it is gone or degraded. Some regulation is essential to ensure long-term wildlife movement through private properties. A crucial aspect of habitat connectivity is buffering habitat in proximity to public roadway crossings structures that provide wildlife permeability across said roadways. All 16 wildlife crossing structures identified by County staff are maintained by either the County or the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans).

Scores of biological studies indicate roadways are major barriers to wildlife movement. Habitat connectivity between northern and southern portions of the County will benefit several species of concern including Southern California’s Distinct Population Segment (DPS) of steelhead (*Oncorhynchus mykiss*) and Evolutionary Significant Unit (ESU) of mountain lion (*Puma concolor*). Studies have also shown habitat to shade and shelter wildlife before and after using a roadway crossing structure increases the utilization of crossing structures.

Because the proposed amendments apply only to new development and includes other broad exemptions, MRCA believes the proposed amendments are modest regulations that will provide significant benefit for wildlife and natural resources.

California Department of Transportation (Caltrans District 7-Los Angeles/Ventura Counties) is writing to express our support for the County-Initiated Amendments to Articles 2 and 6 of the Ventura County Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance which establishes 200-foot setbacks from 16 Wildlife Crossing Structures Located in the Northern Portion of the Ventura County Unincorporated Area (Case Number PL19-0088). Caltrans also supports the County's previous commitments/ amendments (2019) to Ventura County's General Plan [which included creating the Habitat Connectivity and Wildlife Corridor (HCWC) overlay zone and Critical Wildlife Passage Areas (CWPA) overlay zone] to protect wildlife crossing structures.

Caltrans strongly believes that the proposed regulations in the ordinance, which will help to protect areas around wildlife crossing structure entrances (such as Caltrans culverts and bridges) via a 200-foot setback, will help to make wildlife linkages more effective and help to extend habitat for various species. Existing linkages will be more effective with the setback because they will be more permeable, and there will more space for wildlife to find resources. Maintaining existing linkages is critical to protecting regional biodiversity (allowing for greater genetic variability) and increasing climate resilience in Southern California.

Caltrans believes that it is important to prevent reduction in the 200-foot setback areas, especially for Bridge 52-0067 since it is located on a property where historical habitat/creeks for the Federally Endangered Southern California steelhead trout (North Fork Matilija Creek, Bear Creek, and Cannon Creek) converge.

Based on scientific-literature as well as wildlife studies that Caltrans has helped conduct, wildlife fencing can be a very effective tool in reducing wildlife-vehicle collisions. This ordinance combined with Caltrans's efforts to install wildlife fencing to help funnel animals into these permeable areas, will help to will enhance wildlife connectivity between within the Los Padres National Forest and surrounding open spaces, fulfilling Caltrans's mission, values, and high-priority goals and objectives identified in the Caltrans 2020-2024 Strategic Plan. Wildlife fencing will also help to prevent wildlife-vehicle collisions, thereby increasing wildlife and motorist safety. Caltrans's #1 goal as an organization is "safety first". The Ventura County Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance and associated amendments also coincide with Governor Newsom's Safe Road and Wildlife Protection Act.

The long-term resilience of regional biodiversity and ecosystems, due to the pressures of climate change and urbanization, will depend on strengthened wildlife connectivity for various species and ecological processes over time. This ordinance and associated amendments, therefore, is a critical step in protecting the biodiversity and climate resilience of the region. Projects that fall under this ordinance should be exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act due to the associated projects' restorative nature and its importance for biodiversity.

Thank you for this opportunity to express our support for the County-Initiated Amendments to Articles 2 and 6 of the Ventura County Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance.

Dear Ventura County Board of Supervisors:

We are responding to your notice, received in our office via electronic mail on November 17, 2022, for the upcoming Ventura County Board of Supervisors hearing regarding the Ventura County Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance and establishing setbacks from 16 wildlife crossing structures in northern unincorporated Ventura County (Amendments). We are writing to express our support for the proposed amendments to Articles 2 and 6 of the ordinance and the County's efforts to balance development with maintaining connected habitats. As we have noted in previous letters and testimony, the geographic location of Ventura County is uniquely situated to provide the regional habitat connectivity necessary for facilitating wildlife movement and maintaining the integrity of the County's unique ecological communities.

We are fortunate to have large areas of protected habitat within Ventura County in the relatively undisturbed Santa Monica Mountains National Recreational Area to the south and the Los Padres National Forest to the north, as well as natural open spaces that connect these habitats. It is essential that we preserve this connectivity to maintain gene flow and the genetic fitness of native plants and animals, and to allow for adaptation to environmental changes including projected future climate change. Connected habitats allow species with limited ranges such as reptiles and small mammals to shift to adjacent areas if populations experience loss of habitat and facilitate movement of wide-ranging species such as mountain lions (*Puma concolor*) that require large areas to secure needed resources. Connectivity areas also help maintain critical ecological processes for example pollination, seed dispersal, and predator-prey interactions in the habitats they connect.

Buffering wildlife crossings will facilitate the movement of individuals and maintenance of ecological processes for many sensitive and federally listed species the U.S. Fish and Wildlife

Service works to protect. Sensitive and federally listed species occurring in the vicinity of the 16 crossings proposed for buffers include the southwestern pond turtle (*Actinemys pallida*), two-striped garter snake (*Thamnophis hammondi*), Blainsville's horned lizard (*Phrynosoma blainvillii*), spadefoot toad (*Spea hammondi*), blunt-nosed leopard lizard (*Gambusia sila*) and California red-legged frog (*Rana draytonii*).

We support the County's proposed amendments to Articles 2 and 6 of the Ventura County Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance for the inclusion of setbacks (buffers) from important wildlife crossing structures. Ideally, the specification of an appropriate minimum setback distance to ensure that a landscape feature continues to provide functional connectivity should be based on the best available science. However, while there is a growing body of scientific literature on this topic, defining an appropriate science-based buffer is challenging because the minimum recommended distance may depend upon the species, habitat, topography, and impact type (e.g., night lighting, noise, spread of invasive species, disturbance from domestic pets, etc.) under consideration. For example, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service typically requires a 500-foot buffer around occupied least Bell's vireo nests to minimize the likelihood of noise disturbance to nesting vireos, though this buffer may be reduced in some cases if intervening barriers to the transmission of noise exist on the landscape. Because focused research is seldom available for a given species, impact, and location, and because Ventura County's proposed buffers would be implemented to address a range of impacts to multiple species, our recommendation is that a 200-foot setback distance is more likely to preserve the value and function of crossing structures, surface waters, and other connectivity features for wildlife.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's mission is working with others to conserve, protect, and enhance fish, wildlife, and plants and their habitats for the continuing benefit of the American people. These amendments to the zoning ordinance are consistent with that mission, and they may also be beneficial for other Federal agencies in Ventura County who are looking for opportunities to meet the requirements of section 7(a)(1) of the Endangered Species Act of 1973, as amended, for Federal agencies to use their authorities to carry out programs for the conservation of federally listed species.

We are encouraged by and support this and other efforts to promote the conservation of native plants and wildlife and the habitats on which they depend. My name is Tom Warner I live in Lockwood Valley and own a specific property in question of purposed "Wildlife Crossing Structure(s)" 50825-3-14/50825-4-14 at mile marker 18.60/68. I have lived in Lockwood Valley my entire life (66 years as of this writing). I contracted with Ventura Co. Road Department for 30+ years and have worked on every inch of Lockwood Valley Road. I have paved, cleaned crossings, weed abatement, snow plowed and even installed/cleaned culverts.

I am opposed to this structure for the following reasons:

1. To my knowledge Lockwood Valley was exempted from the "Wildlife Corridor" as it was found to be an extremely remote area with few residents and minimal road traffic that would affect wildlife.
2. The area in question is almost in the center of an only sparsely covered sagebrush valley floor with closest trees and homes 1/8 mile away. I believe anyone with knowledge of wildlife knows that they prefer trees for maximum cover not out in basically open fields. You cannot direct wild animals to cross in a specific spot.
3. Under your "Exhibit 21" page 146 of PDF Entire PL16-0127 #7 "Crossings on roads with extremely low traffic volumes were excluded with 200 vehicles trips per day or less." Which Lockwood Valley Rd on average days is less than 200 vehicles.
4. Also, under your "Exhibit 21" page 149 of PDF Entire PL16-0127 "Table 1 Functional Features and their Support of Functional Connectivity: Feature-Proximity to Other Suitable Crossings or lack of nearby culverts that could provide passage within 0.5 miles of the crossing. There are two consecutive large washes at mile marker 17.40 to 17.70 a drainage ditch 300 ft. wide, 20 foot deep and mile marker 17.90 to 18.20 which is Lockwood Creek that is over 300 ft wide and 20 ft deep and has a culvert that is a 3-foot oval.
5. This would be a complete waste of tax payers' money.

In summation:

This is a wide-open valley with only 1 home next to Lockwood Valley Road traveling SW for 12 miles from purposed crossing and first home traveling NE is 1 mile from purposed crossing (see pics). Wildlife has plenty of places to cross and traffic is very minimal. This crossing would be somewhat understandable if Lockwood Valley Rd. was a freeway, interstate or highway. Planning seems to think you can dictate where an animal can cross a roadway which is ludicrous. Please listen to the following audio of a call to a radio station regarding Deer Crossing signs:

Dear Chair LaVere and Members of the Board:

More than three years ago, the Board of Supervisors voted to give wildlife more room to roam in Ventura County by establishing unique and important protections for habitat connectivity and wildlife movement corridors linking the Santa Monica Mountains and Los Padres National Forest. Adoption of those ordinances established Ventura County as a leader in wildlife protection in California and throughout the nation.

The Planning Commission recently added to this legacy by recommending that your Board adopt additional amendments to the Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance (NCZO). These amendments would further protect wildlife movement in Ventura County by establishing 200-foot setbacks from 16 key wildlife crossing structures in the northern part of the county where the previously approved wildlife movement corridor protections do not apply. The undersigned organizations, which represent thousands of your constituents, strongly support the proposed amendments to the NCZO.

There is no doubt that, if adopted, the 200-foot setbacks will benefit a variety of animals from mountain lions to steelhead. The 16 identified wildlife crossing structures in northern Ventura County are vital to the ability of these animals to safely cross roads. Certain types of development and land uses immediately adjacent to the crossing structures could negatively impact the willingness of animals to utilize them, possibly leading to riskier movement across roads where vehicle-related mortality is common. Animals directly crossing roads rather than using structures such as underpasses endangers not only the wildlife but also drivers. And when one animal is struck by a vehicle on the road, it may attract scavengers that are then in danger of being struck as well, creating a dangerous feedback loop.

The proposed amendments are not overly burdensome to landowners, and they would affect a relatively small number of wildlife crossing structures in Ventura County. However, these small changes to the NCZO will go a long way in protecting both wildlife and public safety in Ojai, Cuyama Valley, Lockwood Valley, and along the well-used Maricopa Highway.

We urge you to vote for wildlife, healthy ecosystems, and driver safety by adopting the proposed amendments.


This memorandum is in response to a comment letter from Dream Grove LLC (Dream Grove) dated November 11, 2022. The commenter requests that the proposed ordinance be amended to omit Wildlife Crossing Structure ID 52-0067 or reduce the proposed 200-foot setback to 75 feet for the property located at 16825 Maricopa Hwy, CA 93023 (APN 0090060070). As explained in more detail below, the Planning Division disagrees with Dream Grove's comments and its proposed modifications. The following italicized comments are restated verbatim from Dream Grove's November 11, 2022 letter along with responses by Planning Division staff.

Comment 1:

The neighboring property across the street, 16840 Maricopa Hwy, has a topography situation similar to 16825, in that there is very limited buildable land and that property's only buildable area is almost completely within the 200-foot crossing setback. By right, that property would be exempt from the limitations imposed by this proposed regulation because a primary residence on a legal buildable lot would always be an owner's right. It makes no sense that 16840 would be allowed an exemption to the proposed regulation at the same crossing and within the same setback limits to build a structure just a stone's throw across the road, while 16825 would still be held to its strict interpretation and no construction allowed on very valuable and scarce 'flat' land.

Planning Division Response to Comment 1: The Planning Division disagrees with this comment. The comment compares two properties within Wheeler Canyon that both have sites that would be located within the proposed 200-foot setback area of Wildlife Crossing Structure ID 52-0067. The property at 16840 Maricopa Hwy. is a 1.76-acre parcel with approximately 0.5 acre of buildable area* (See Figure A, below). The commenter’s parcel at 16825 Maricopa Hwy. is a 59.12-acre parcel with several available buildable areas outside of the setback totaling approximately 3.75 acres of buildable area* (See Figure A, red polygon areas on right); the commenter’s parcel has historically been developed with a bathhouse, trailers, single family dwelling/tavern, pool, etc., with all such development sited outside of the proposed 200-ft setback area. Due to the large differences between the two parcel sizes and potential buildable areas, the parcel at 16840 Maricopa Hwy. is not comparable to the commenter’s parcel. There are multiple suitable sites on the commenter’s property for development, unlike the neighboring property where the only suitable building area is entirely within the proposed 200-foot setback area. (See Figure A, light blue circle at bottom).

* Note: The calculated buildable areas shown in Figure A were estimated by identifying previous graded, cleared, and developed areas with relatively low percentages of slope. The estimated acreages of buildable area for each property were calculated through Google Earth tool to measure the area of each polygon. These estimates were made for the sole purpose of comparing the potentially developable areas on the two parcels identified in Comment 1 and further analysis would be needed during the permitting process for new development.

Comment 2:

Looking at the surrounding ownership of the lands near this crossing, the south side (downstream) of the waterway is generally privately owned in this specific area, and is a 'neighborhood' of relatively dense maintained yards and houses. But the north and east areas slightly upstream are public lands, (national forest). It appears that animals could cross under the highway and easily continue on their way to the open, public lands without stepping foot on either 16825 or 16840. Neither property would cause any significant obstruction. In other words, animals do not need to cross or go near 16825 in this area to get to their linked open spaces. The far side of the river is all public land on both sides of the bridge. Crossing the 16825 property would only serve as a longer route to the same destination, the hillsides the west and north.

Planning Division Response to Comment 2: The Planning Division disagrees with this comment. An important consideration in the use of a wildlife crossing structure is the topographic relief of the surrounding area and the landscape features within the 200-foot buffer. Effective crossing structures are located where natural features such as ridgelines, low lying riparian areas, or a corridor of vegetation lead to the structure. Streams and their associated riparian areas have long been recognized as biodiversity hotspots between freshwater systems and upland habitats. Many species that rely on these aquatic habitats also rely on the adjacent upland habitats. In fact, 60% of amphibian species, 16% of reptiles, 34% of birds and 12% of mammals in the Pacific Coast ecoregion depend on riparian-stream systems for survival.¹ Many other species, including mountain lions and bobcats, often use riparian areas and natural ridgelines as migration corridors or foraging habitat.^{2,3,4,5}

In order to show graphically these properties and their wildlife movement relationship the following figures are provided. Figure B below shows a diagram of private property boundaries and US Forest Service land. It is followed by Figure C that represents a large-scale diagram of wildlife movement based upon use of riparian and ridgeline corridors within the Wheeler Springs Valley area. The commenter's assertion that wildlife do not need to cross or set foot on either property to access public open space on either side of the bridge is not supported by the wildlife studies and research. It is more likely that wildlife are moving through the multiple riparian corridors that enter the property from the north and northwest parts of the national forest and link into the main stem of the North Fork of the Matilija Creek through Wheeler Springs Valley. In addition, there are several opportunities for wildlife to travel between the ridgelines and the property itself to access resources such as water, food, and to migrate to other areas using the wildlife crossing structures available at either end of the valley.





Figure C: Overview of Wheeler Springs Valley Showing Riparian and Ridgeline Wildlife Movement Corridors



Comment 3:

Most importantly, the way the regulation is written, there is a significant number of exemptions allowed for all kinds of commercial activities and land uses. If one would want to build or modify the land in the 200-foot zone, it is possible to find an exemption to 'work around' the regulation. This completely misses the spirit and value of the regulation in the first place. We see the value of providing animals safe passage across the road, but the broad exemptions make this regulation more of a gesture than an effective tool in animals' interest. Because we not intend to utilize the property for commercial use, we are being penalized for actually trying to limit our footprint on the property by forcing additional restrictions on top of our own self-imposed intentions to limit development. In other words, a rancher/farmer could utilize every bit of this property for AG ventures with little to no accommodation for this regulation, but we, keeping a much lower profile and footprint on the land, are penalized with the full force of this regulation.

Planning Division Response to Comment 3: The Planning Division disagrees with this comment. The exemptions for the proposed ordinance were selected based upon the applicable General Plan land use designations and allowed uses in the County's Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance, current state/federal laws, and with consideration of existing development within the proposed 200-foot setback areas. The exemptions were selected to balance the protection of wildlife and the wildlife crossing structures with private property rights, delivery of public services, and less intensive land uses when possible. As noted in the Planning Commission Staff Report (Exhibit 1), different wildlife species respond to favorable wildlife crossing structure types (e.g., culverts vs. bridges), as well as different characteristics around entry/exit points of the structures (e.g., heavy vegetative cover vs. light vegetative cover, distance to suitable habitat). The ideal environmental conditions for wildlife within the 200-foot setback area are: 1) vegetation cover; 2) no new structures or development; and 3) limited human disturbance and activities such as lighting, noise, domestic pets, fuel clearance, trash, etc. (Exhibit 1, SR Exhibit 10). The commenter suggests that the exemptions for commercial activities and land uses are too numerous and defeat the purpose of the ordinance. However, as explained below, the proposed exemptions for commercial land uses and activities are limited and reflect a fair balancing of land uses and property interests to protect wildlife crossing structures, as follows:

Commercial Agriculture: The exemptions for agricultural operations are limited to: 1) livestock grazing; 2) Apiculture; 3) temporary outdoor lighting such as lighting associated with weather events; and 4) the planting or harvesting of crops or orchards that will be commercially sold, including vegetation modification necessary to construct or maintain a driveway or road for that commercial activity. However, new agricultural uses and structures including, for example, animal husbandry, service and storage yards, agricultural buildings or structures, and other associated accessory uses pursuant to Section 8105-4 of the Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance would be subject to the proposed ordinance and prohibited from occurring within the 200-foot setback area of a wildlife crossing structure. The exemptions for commercial agriculture uses in the Proposed Ordinance are limited to less intensive allowable uses and activities.

Furthermore, limited agricultural exemptions were included because four of the 200-foot setback areas (Wildlife Crossing Structure IDs # 322, 50821 3-4, 52-0086, 52-088) are zoned Agricultural Exclusive (AE). The purpose of this zone is defined within the Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance as follows:

"The purpose of this zone is to preserve and protect commercial agricultural lands as a limited and irreplaceable resource, to preserve and maintain agriculture as a major industry in Ventura County and to protect these areas from the encroachment of nonrelated uses which, by their nature, would have detrimental effects upon the agriculture industry."

The Agricultural Element of the County's 2040 General Plan contains numerous policies to protect agricultural activities and prevent the loss of important farmland (AG-1.1, 1.2, 1.6, 1.8, 2.2, 3.1).

Surface Mining: Two wildlife crossing structures are located near an existing gravel mine, the Ojai Quarry, that is authorized by an approved Conditional Use Permit (Bridge ID's 52-044 and 52-043) (Exhibit 1, SR 7). Surface mining operations are protected by state laws and local policies. They require a Conditional Use Permit, which is a discretionary action and subject to environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Impacts to wildlife movement are evaluated and addressed as part of the environmental review process required by CEQA. Consequently, any new or modified development within these setback areas would be subject to discretionary approval, environmental review, and potential imposition of mitigation measures. Therefore, the surface mining operations are proposed to be exempt from the ordinance because any significant impacts to wildlife movement on the wildlife crossing structures would be addressed through the conditional use permit process.

Comment 4:

In conclusion, it seems clear this property warrants a serious look at being excluded from the unfair burdens placed upon it by pulling the adjacent crossing from the regulation, or by reducing the setback to 75' which would still afford a buffer area for wildlife while still allowing for an unencumbered entrance to the property and a structure near that entrance. Along with considering a general exclusion or setback adjustment, we are open to discussing compensation for the loss of rights for the portion of the land effected by the proposed regulation, and if necessary, would work with Graham Lyons of Mullen & Henzell LLP to reach such an agreement with the County. We are looking at our relationship with the County as a partnership, and we truly believe that there are regulations that can be of use towards the greater good. We are willing to compromise and give up certain freedoms towards this ideal, but as with any relationship, we expect the County to also show some flexibility, and to see that it's a win/win if both parties can show they can give up something to reach agreement.

Planning Division Response to Comment 4: The Planning Division disagrees with this comment's conclusion. The Planning Division does not recommend the removal of the wildlife crossing structure or reduction of the setback for the following reasons:

- 1) As explained in responses 1 through 3, the proposed ordinance does not impose an unfair burden upon the property owner of 16825 Maricopa Hwy. such that Wildlife Crossing Structure ID 52-0067 should be removed from the proposed ordinance or the setback reduced to 75 feet. As with any setback requirement, the property owner may request a discretionary variance from the Planning Commission pursuant to Section 8111-1.2.2.2 of the Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance but would need to meet its burden of proving entitlement to a variance. The fact that the property owner may not be able to develop a small portion of their much larger property due to the proposed setback regulation does not meet the standard of a constitutional taking or raise any other legitimate legal issue.
- 2) Wildlife crossing research studies have shown that human disturbances negatively affect the rate of wildlife utilizing crossing structures (Exhibit 1, SR Exhibit 10). Development within the 200-foot setback area of Wildlife Crossing Structure ID 52-0067 is not compatible with its function as a wildlife crossing structure for both the terrestrial and aquatic wildlife that pass under it for the following reasons:
 - a. The potential buildable area within the setback area is surrounded on three sides by the North Fork of Matilija Creek (Figure D below). Due to the size of the potential flat area available, any structure would be required to be sited within 15-75 feet of the creek bank (dependent on size/type of structure). In addition, this is a high fire hazard zone. Riparian vegetation removal may be required due to fire safety fuel modification zone requirements (clearance impacts to 3 sides of creek). Due to the proximity to the creek banks, development within the proposed setback area for Wildlife Crossing Structure ID 52-0067 is likely to have a significant impact on the aquatic, riparian, and upland habitats than at any other location on the subject property.

- b. The North Fork of Matilija Creek is home to numerous sensitive aquatic species such as the anadromous Southern Steelhead (*Oncorhynchus mykiss*), which migrates from the sea up the Ventura River into the North Fork. This species is federally endangered and on April 27, 2022, was listed as a candidate species under California Environmental Species Act. Potential impacts to the species associated with development in the setback area include: outdoor lighting, which alters predator prey relationships resulting in increased mortality of out-migrating juveniles; loss of vegetation/trees that results in increase of water temperatures, runoff and sedimentation, and decreased water quality; the installation of a groundwater well for residential use would decrease creek surface flow; and any stream channelization to prevent flooding or streambank stabilization can impact spawning habitat.
- c. Bridge IDs 52-0066 and 52-0067 associated with this area are considered important crossing points under Route 33 for this area due to the number of wildlife movement routes feeding into the valley (Figure C, above). In addition, the reduction of the setback or removal of the structure from the proposed regulations has the potential to discourage wildlife moving out of the Wheeler Springs Valley to the East. It is at this location where the valley narrows and becomes very steep on all sides- leaving very few exit points without having to double back, cross Route 33, or scale a very steep slope as shown in Figure D below.

The Planning Division submits the following revisions to the proposed ordinance amending Articles 2 and 6 of the Ventura County Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance (Exhibits 3 and 4 to the Board of Supervisors letter) to correct the road name for Ventura County Culvert ID's 50821-3-4, 50822-5-7, and 50825-4-14 in Table 1 of Section 8106-6.5.1, which should read "Lockwood Valley Road" not "State Route 33, Maricopa Highway". These revisions are provided below and will be noted during the staff presentation.

Note: Inclusions and deletions to the sections are indicated in **red text** with underline and **strikeouts** respectively.

Section 8106-6.5.1 – Wildlife Crossing Structures

The regulations within this Section 8106-6.5 shall apply to wildlife crossing structures identified in Tables 1 and 2 (below), and the 200-foot setback area set forth in Section 8106-6.5.4.


Road Barriers and Wildlife

Roads and highways have dramatic effects on wildlife movement and landscape connectivity.



A 2021 study by UC Davis shows wildlife-vehicle collisions cost California ~\$2 billion over last 5-years (including State Farm Insurance data)

- Involved over 400 species including mammals, birds, amphibians, and reptiles
- Most wildlife-vehicle collisions are not reported
- Wildlife crossing structures with the help of fencing have been shown that it can alleviate this problem

- Predominately Undeveloped
- Creek/Streams
- Large Lots
- Orchards/Crop Land (4)
- Structures (4)
- Surface Mine (2)



Proposed Amendments to the Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance (Articles 2 and 6)

What Would the Proposed Setbacks Prohibit?

Unless exempt, the following types of **NEW** development, structures, land uses, and activities would be prohibited from occurring within the 200-foot setback area

- New structures or additions to structures that require a permit under Article 5 including any associated fuel modification zones
- Vegetation modification activities
- New or modified landscape areas
- New/replacement wildlife impermeable fencing installed within the bed or bank of a stream/river
- New or replacement outdoor lighting
- New indoor lighting for see-through greenhouses 9

Exemptions

Proposed a Total of 27 Exemptions in the Following Categories:

- Vegetation Modification
- Development, Land Uses, & Activities
- Outdoor Lighting



Exemptions to Setback Areas

Development and Land Uses

- Repair or maintenance of an existing, legally established structure or fence
- Previous improvements destroyed by a natural disaster
- Surface mining authorized by an approved CUP
- Uses protected by vested right or to minimum extent necessary to avoid a taking of property
- Livestock grazing, commercial harvesting/planting of crops, and apiculture

Vegetation Modification

- Required by Fire District, federal or state law, conducted by public agency, or conservation organization, or in landscape area
- Allowed by an existing permit or a restoration/ enhancement plan
- To construct/maintain a driveway/road used for commercial crop production

Outdoor Lighting

- Temporary lighting for road maintenance, emergencies, agricultural and permitted uses
- Lighting required by federal or state law, permit, or order
- Lighting shielded & directed downward with an output of 60 lumens or less
- Replacement of safety and security lighting

Nonconforming Structures

The expansion of an existing structure may occur if either:

- Located completely outside the 200-foot setback area; OR
- Does not increase the footprint of the structure in the setback area and it meets the specified criteria







Planning Division Response (Exhibit 6)




(Culverts less than 10 ft in diameter)

Bridges or Culverts greater than 10 feet in diameter






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
