PROJECT SUMMARY: The project consists of a County-initiated ordinance to amend Articles 2 and 6 of the Ventura County Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance to establish a 200-foot setback from fourteen (14) bridges and culverts that have been identified as important functional wildlife crossing structures to improve safe passage for wildlife and vehicles in the northern unincorporated area. • Article 2: Amends the definition of "wildlife crossing structure" to clarify that flood plain facilities may also be a barrier for wildlife connectivity; that wildlife crossing structures are used by both terrestrial and aquatic wildlife, and to reflect that an existing map layer within the County View Geographic Information System will be updated to include the locations of the 14 wildlife crossing structures that are the subject of the proposed ordinance. • Article 6: Establishes a 200-foot setback area from the entry and exit points of 14 wildlife crossing structures: 1. The Grantee shall pay to the County, within 15 days after the time for filing the above-mentioned statement, in lawful money of the United States, the annual fee due. Any neglect, omission or refusal by Grantee to file the verified statement, or to pay the franchise fee at the time or in the manner provided, shall make the Grantee subject to penalties as detailed in Sections 11, 13 and 14 of Ordinance P-3 (Fourth Revision), and/or constitutes grounds for declaration of forfeiture of the franchise and of all rights thereat.
