Dear Supervisors;

I am a life long Ventura County resident, and a life long voter. I am dismayed to see on the agenda an effort to make voting for Ventura county residents not more accessible, but more difficult. To me this is anti democratic. This effort is trying to sow distrust in our election process here in Ventura County. I have the utmost faith in the integrity of our elections, and in our Ventura County Clerk Recorder and Registrar of Voters, Michelle Ascension.

This effort includes:

1. Reinstate an independent Election Fraud Hotline and Election Inspectors Office – *This cannot be “reinstated” as it has never existed; however citizens are able to call and report any suspected fraud. The Elections division already immediately investigates any reports.*
2. Appoint a Citizen's Election Oversight Commission. *The County Clerk Recorder and Registrar of Voters already follows all state laws; and there are other committees to join to be part of the process.*
3. **By Ordinance, elections in Ventura County shall be one day, precinct elections. (No more early voting!) This is particularly distressing to me, working people, people who have to pick up children from child care, Sr Citizens, people who want to take their time and carefully read their ballot. Why confine voting to one day, one precinct? What about our service members, or people who are away from home that day for any number of reasons? The only purpose of this proposal is to limit voting to a very select few. In the last elections where mail in ballots were sent automatically, 90% of our residents utilized them. This speaks for itself. Besides, it is now State Law and as such is not within the Board’s authority to change.**
4. By Ordinance, any use of electronic tabulation machines shall be accompanied by a full 100% citizens assisted hand-count audit. *This is dumb. Humans have a much higher error than the machines, which are tested prior to the election.*
5. By Ordinance, no scanning, counting or preprocessing of ballots in any form shall take place before Election Day. *This again, is contrary to state law, and has no rational to support getting ahead of a huge workload.*

Please vote no on all of these voter suppression tactics. Thank you for upholding our

democracy, possibly your most important role as a County Supervisor.

To the Board of Supervisors of Ventura County, California:

We understand that certain parties will advocate that the County of Ventura opt out or restrict the voting options authorized by the Voters' Choice of the California Voter's Choice Act (VCA) at the above-referenced Board of Supervisors meeting. **We oppose and request that the Board reject any such proposals for the following reasons:**

1. **Legislative Purpose of the VCA:** The VCA was enacted and adopted by 29 counties of CA, including the County of Ventura, in order to encourage and expand participation in the democratic process by all California citizens. It does so by authorizing a variety of state-approved, secure methods of voting.
2. **Public Policy:** The VCA favors the general public by providing access to voting for California citizens who, due to long work hours, family obligations, disability & handicaps, economic hardships and other reasons, do not have the time to wait in long lines for voting due to restricted voting hours at a limited number of physical locations.
3. **Issues of Fairness, Equal Protection, and Accountability:** The VCA encourages voter "buy-in" and citizen satisfaction which leads to collaborative government as well as law-abiding behavior by citizens and by their elected representatives by encouraging maximum voter participation.
4. **No Evidence of Fraud:** There is no legitimate evidence of fraud in any of the methods of voting (including mail-in ballots) specifically approved and authorized by the VCA that would justify withdrawing from or restricting the voting options of the VCA.
5. **VCA Withdrawal or Restricting of VCA-Authorized Voting Options Would Constitute Voter Suppression:** Any effort by the Ventura County Board of Supervisors to withdraw from or in any way restrict the voting options provided by the VCA would justifiably be viewed by voters as an effort to suppress and limit voters rights. By restricting the rights of voters as a whole, the Board
would increase the power of some ideologically-driven voters over others. It would enable an unpopular decision of a minority to prevail over the majority. In addition to being unfair, any such
action by the Board would harm the reputation of Ventura County resulting in decreased commerce, decreased property values and decreased tax revenue.

We will, as will all concerned and involved citizens, be watching your statements and actions at the upcoming meeting with the utmost care and attention. You were elected to maintain the democratic values of all Ventura County citizens, not only those of a vocal minority. We hope you will act for the good of the majority. Thank you.

Dear Board of Supervisors:

It has come to my attention that there is a group of individuals who are calling for County election reform. This is being addressed at your June 18th meeting as Agenda Item #93. I am writing to express my concerns with regard to any proposed changes to the existing system.

The petitioners are proposing that the Board “reinstate” an independent Election Fraud Hotline and Election Inspectors Office. However, it is my understanding that there has never been an independent hotline or inspector. I believe that the Clerk-Recorder’s (C-R) Office is converting their toll-free 800 number to a “hotline,” but I understand that people have always been able to call the C-R’s Office mainline to report issues, and their office acts on those issues promptly. And I believe that the C-R’s Office investigates all reported or suspected voter fraud attempts and refers cases to the District Attorney’s Office as appropriate.

The petitioners are also seeking to appoint a “Citizen's Election Oversight Commission.” This is odd in that the C-R’s office, I believe, currently follows state and federal law, which affords citizens, who want to be “involved”, the ability to join its language/accessibility advisory committees, observe ballot processing in the office, or apply to be an election worker.

Thirdly, the petitioners are asking that in Ventura County we revert to one day only, precinct staffed elections. This sounds like an effort to do away with the Voter’s Choice Act (VCA) and make it more difficult for people to vote in person. This is particularly odd in that Vote-by-Mail is the preferred method of up to 90% of Ventura County voters, and that method is required by state law for every registered voter. How can Ventura County become more restrictive? It is difficult enough to get people to vote on working days, and finding poll workers is becoming more difficult as many of the previous participants are aging out. Additionally, with the increase of potential violence toward poll workers, finding precinct workers is even more difficult.

A fourth request of theirs is the Board adopt an ordinance that says that any use of electronic tabulation machines shall be accompanied by a full 100% citizens assisted hand count audit. Again, it’s my understanding that a 100% hand audit is unrealistic, as it is slower and more error-prone

than machine tabulation. I believe that State Law requires the Clerk-Recorder's office to perform full testing of every piece of equipment prior to the election, and after the election, the C-R's Office conducts a 1% random hand tally as required by state law to further ensure the tabulators are counting accurately. Hand tabulations throughout the nation have not proven to be any more accurate than the machine counts.

And lastly, the petitioners are seeking the adoption of an ordinance so that there would be no scanning, counting, or preprocessing of ballots in any form that would take place before Election Day. Again, it's my understanding that State law allows ballot processing to begin as early as when the ballots go out in the mail. The C-R's Office has indicated to me that due to the extensive process of preparing Vote-by-Mail ballots for counting (signature verification, opening envelopes and flattening ballots) the C-R's Office uses that extra prep time to be able to produce a batch of results once the polls close on election night. I understand that ballot data from preprocessing remains raw and uncompiled until 8 p.m. on Election Night, so the vote totals are unknown beforehand. There is no "secret" counting or anything else underhanded going on.

I have listened to a podcast by one of the petitioners, and this sounds to me like one more attempt to suppress everyone's right to vote that is eligible just because someone didn't like the outcome of the last election(s). I can understand their anger and frustration, but Ventura County's voting system was put into place under the watchful of a conservative Clerk-Recorder for whom I have the upmost respect, and I find it fair and effective. There is absolutely no reason to "fix something" that is not broken. Additionally, I'm wondering what the "ripple effects" of such an ordinance would be on the 10 cities that use the Election's Office for their own local elections.

Please only "receive and file" this request. And I urge you to support the Clerk-Recorder's request, Item #11, in your Consent Calendar.

We understand that certain parties will be advocating that the County of Ventura opt out or restrict the voting options authorized by the Voters' Choice of the California Voter's Choice Act (VCA) at the above-referenced Board of Supervisors meeting. We oppose and request that the Board reject any such proposal(s) for the following reasons, among others:

1. Legislative Purpose and Objective of the VCA: The VCA was enacted, and now adopted by 29 counties in California including the County of Ventura, for the purpose of encouraging and expanding participation in the democratic process by all citizens of the state of California. It does so by authorizing a variety of state-approved, secure methods for how voters can cast their ballots.

2. Public Policy: The VCA reflects a strong public policy in favor of providing access to California citizens who, for reasons of long working hours, family obligations, disability and handicaps, economic hardships and other reasons, do not have the time or luxury to wait in long lines during rigidly restricted hours at a limited number of physical locations, in order to cast their ballots.

3. Issues of Fairness, Equal Protection, Accountability and Comity: Aside from the strong public policy favoring maximum voter participation, as well as general social and ethical considerations of fairness and equal protection, enabling California citizens who care enough to inform themselves and vote on state, county and local issues encourages voter "buy-in" and overall citizen satisfaction that leads to smooth and collaborative governance, as well as responsible law-abiding behavior, by citizens and their elected representatives.

4. No Evidence of Fraud Justifying a Change in Authorized Voting Options: There is no legitimate evidence of widespread fraud or deficiencies in any of the methods of voting specifically approved and authorized by the VCA that would justify any action to withdraw from or restrict the voting options provided by the VCA.

5. VCA Withdrawal or Restrictions of VCA-Authorized Voting Options would Constitute, and be Viewed as, Voter Suppression: In light of the above considerations, any effort by the Ventura County Board of Supervisors to withdraw from or in any way restrict the voting options provided by the VCA would be justifiably viewed by voters in Ventura County and elsewhere as an effort to suppress and limit voters rights, and thereby impermissibly increase the influence and power of some ideologically-driven voters over others. In addition to being against public policy and intrinsically unfair, any such action by the Board would do reputational harm to Ventura County, which would likely result in decreased commerce and a decrease in property values and tax revenue.

Please be advised that we will, as concerned and involved citizens can and should, be watching your statements and actions at the upcoming meeting with the utmost care and attention.

We can assure you that any efforts to minimize rights so fundamental to democratic values and governance will be met with full accountability in future elections.

We understand that certain parties will be advocating that the County of Ventura opt out or restrict the voting options authorized by the Voters' Choice of the California Voter's Choice Act (VCA) at the above-referenced Board of Supervisors meeting. We oppose and request that the Board reject any such proposal(s) for the following reasons, among others:

1. **Legislative Purpose and Objective of the VCA:** The VCA was enacted, and now adopted by 29 counties in California including the County of Ventura, for the purpose of encouraging and expanding participation in the democratic process by all citizens of the state of California. It does so by authorizing a variety of state-approved, secure methods for how voters can cast their ballots.
2. **Public Policy:** The VCA reflects a strong public policy in favor of providing access to California citizens who, for reasons of long working hours, family obligations, disability and handicaps, economic hardships and other reasons, do not have the time or luxury to wait in long lines during rigidly restricted hours at a limited number of physical locations, in order to cast their ballots.
3. **Issues of Fairness, Equal Protection, Accountability and Comity:** Aside from the strong public policy favoring maximum voter participation, as well as general social and ethical considerations of fairness and equal protection, enabling California citizens who care enough to inform themselves and vote on state, county and local issues encourages voter "buy-in" and overall citizen satisfaction that leads to smooth and collaborative governance, as well as responsible law-abiding behavior, by citizens and their elected representatives.
4. **No Evidence of Fraud Justifying a Change in Authorized Voting Options:** There is no legitimate evidence of widespread fraud or deficiencies in any of the methods of voting specifically approved and authorized by the VCA that would justify any action to withdraw from or restrict the voting options provided by the VCA.
5. **VCA Withdrawal or Restrictions of VCA-Authorized Voting Options would Constitute, and be Viewed as, Voter Suppression:** In light of the above considerations, any effort by the Ventura County Board of Supervisors to withdraw from or in any way restrict the voting options provided by the VCA would be justifiably viewed by voters in Ventura County and elsewhere as

an effort to suppress and limit voters rights, and thereby impermissibly increase the influence and power of some ideologically-driven voters over others. In addition to being against public policy and intrinsically unfair, any such action by the Board would do reputational harm to Ventura County, which would likely result in decreased commerce and a decrease in property values and tax revenue.

Please be advised that we will, as concerned and involved citizens can and should, be watching your statements and actions at the upcoming meeting with the utmost care and attention.

We can assure you that any efforts to minimize rights so fundamental to democratic values and governance will be met with full accountability in future elections.
