Key Milestones for Carmen Ramirez FJC



County of Ventura purchases Oxnard building for future home of the Carmen Ramirez Family Justice Center

OXNARD, Calif. – The County of Ventura has entered into an agreement to purchase a building in downtown Oxnard, which will serve as the future home of the Carmen Ramirez Family Justice Center.

The two-story, 32,000-square-foot building, located at 555/545 South A Street, is anticipated to be purchased for \$4.1 million contingent upon an environmental review, Board of Supervisors approval, and the completion of a 30-day escrow. Situated near transit and city services, this location will provide outreach and support services to victims of crime in the cities of Oxnard and Port Hueneme.

"Underserved families of the Fifth District deserve a safe and welcoming space where they can receive support services to help improve their lives," Ventura County Supervisor Vianey Lopez said. "I want to thank District Attorney Erik Nasarenko, Chief Deputy District Attorney Mike Jump, and the entire District Attorney's Office for their hard work in making this happen. Opening a Family Justice Center in Oxnard was the vision of my predecessor, and dear friend, Carmen Ramirez who saw the need for such services in our community and was working hard to make it a reality. As a former Councilmember in Oxnard, I supported the city's commitment to the Family Justice Center and I am pleased to further my support now, as Supervisor."

The new Family Justice Center will be named after the late Ventura County Supervisor Carmen Ramirez, who was the consummate fighter for crime victims and marginalized Oxnard residents. During her decades of public service, Ramirez recognized that undocumented, migrant field workers, and the region's residents of Mexican and indigenous descent were especially susceptible to being victimized. Oftentimes, cultural and linguistic barriers prevented these residents from reporting crimes and receiving the justice and services they deserve.

"In recognition of Carmen and the communities she loved and served, I am pleased to name the Family Justice Center in her honor," said District Attorney Erik Nasarenko. "This will serve as a lasting and enduring tribute to her decades of work improving the lives of Oxnard residents, especially those who have been victimized by crime."

The Family Justice Center, a resource administered by the Ventura County District Attorney's Office, is a community support system that uses a holistic approach to uplift and empower victims and their families. The Ventura County Family Justice Center offers a comprehensive selection of services to Ventura County residents seeking a safe environment to recover, heal, and break the cycle of violence.

Santa Paula Architectural Firm Approved for Carmen Ramirez Family Justice Center in Oxnard



VENTURA, Calif. – At the regular meeting, on Tuesday, December 5, 2023, the Ventura County Board of Supervisors unanimously approved a professional services contract with Anderson Kulwiec Appleby Architects (AKA), from Santa Paula. The architectural firm will be completing architectural and engineering services for the remodel of the recently acquired 545-555 South A Street building in Oxnard, the future home of the Carmen Ramirez Family Justice Center (FJC).

"I want to thank the Board of Supervisors for approving the contract, which will enable a reputable Santa Paula-based architectural firm to design the remodel of portions of the building's first and second floors," said District Attorney Erik Nasarenko. "This moves the project one step closer to providing victim-based services for Ventura County residents."

The \$239,900 contract with AKA Architects will help transform the two-story, 32,000 sq. ft. building into the home of a second FJC located in the county. The construction plan is laid out in four phases: Pre-Design, Schematic Design, Construction Documents, and Construction

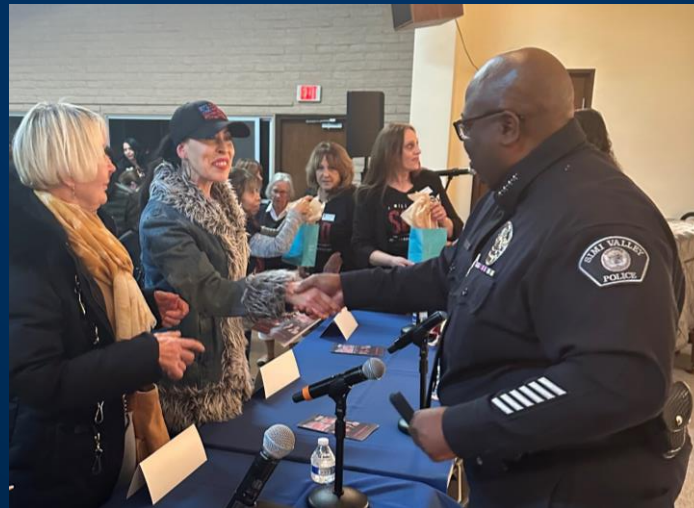
