Sufficient revenue and appropriations are included in the FY 23-24 adopted budget. The operational income includes "Operating Transfers In" that are primarily attributed to County contribution.

STRATEGIC PLAN PRIORITY:

The item presented in this Board letter supports the Healthy, Safe, and Resilient Communities strategic priority of the County Strategic Plan as it is designed to meet the goal of providing access to quality healthcare required for our community to thrive.

DISCUSSION:

Under the existing Specialist Care Professional Services Agreement with Clinicas, HCA provides a full range of specialty care physician services to Clinicas patients. Recently, HCA has proposed restructuring its relationship with Clinicas to increase the Medi-Cal payments HCA receives for services rendered at its ambulatory care clinics that operate as federally qualified health centers (FQHCs). The proposed Amendment would provide a short-term increase in the FQHC rates while negotiations continue on a restructured contract.

Under the proposed Amendment, for FQHC services provided on and after January 1, 2024, Clinicas would pay a flat fee for each FQHC visit so that HCA would be paid no less than the average Prospective Payment System (PPS) rate established for each clinic by Medi-Cal. PPS rates are set by Medi-Cal to ensure that FQHC clinics are paid an amount at least equal to their cost of providing care for Medi-Cal recipients.

The new rates would remain in effect until June 30, 2024.
