Clean Harbors operates a Permanent HHW Collection Facility and Door-to-Door Collections for the City. The program accepts HHW including pesticides, universal waste, e-waste and sharps.

4 Scope of Work

Clean Harbors understands the Ventura County Agricultural Commissioner's (CAC) Office is seeking a contractor to provide collection, packaging, transportation and disposal services of agricultural pesticides in Ventura County and would like the vendor to provide the labor, equipment and materials to hold a safe collection event.

Clean Harbors has the capacity to conduct this program in accordance with all Federal and State regulations. Materials will be packaged at the collection site and transported to our RCRA incinerator in Aragonite, UT. Any pesticides that cannot be managed by incineration, (i.e., arsenical based pesticides), will be sent to a landfill, after initial receipt in Aragonite.

In addition to the scope above, Clean Harbors will perform the following services:

- ✓ Provide a Health & Safety/Contingency Plan for the event.
- ✓ Provide all equipment, supplies and personnel to efficiently and competently perform site set-up, breakdown, collection, packaging, transportation, and disposal of all waste pesticides collected.
- ✓ Provide waste profiling, preparation of manifests, tracking and reporting of all waste collected.
- ✓ Provide a final report, including signed manifests showing receipt of pesticides at disposal facility, certificates of destruction, and any other waste management tracking documentation.

4.1 Health and Safety Plan

Immediately following project initiation, Clean Harbors will prepare a "site specific" Health and Safety Plan (HASP). The HASP will include, under a separate cover, an emergency response/contingency plan that will address possible emergency situations (e.g. spills, chemical reactions, fires, etc.). The HASP will be distributed to authorized program personnel prior to commencement of any on-site work associated with the site operations (a minimum of ten days prior to the scheduled collection date).

Clean Harbors staff has extensive experience in writing detailed Health and Safety Plans, specifically those intended for large scale chemical collection programs including lab packing and bulking operations. The HASP will address the following safety issues:

4.2 Pesticide Collection Event Location

Clean Harbors will work closely with the County to determine a suitable collection location, preferably at a County operated location to minimize liability.

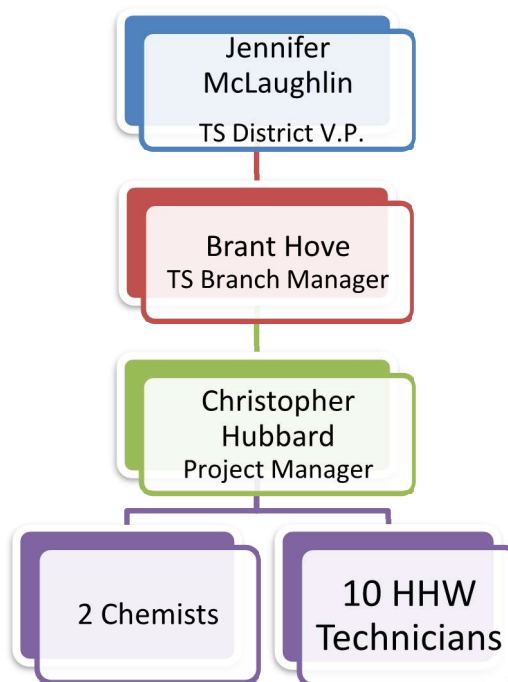
In consultation with the County, Clean Harbors will set up the waste collection area that is mutually agreeable to both parties.

4.3 Proposed Staffing

The Ventura County Pesticide Disposal Program (PDP) will be overseen by Brant Hove, Technical Services Branch Manager. Mr. Hove has extensive experience in the successful execution of these types of events.

The following organizational chart traces the local office structure from field operations personnel to Clean Harbors' District Manager level; and represents the managerial flow chart under which the proposed services will be operated by Clean Harbors.

Chrisotpher Hubbard, your Project Manager, will serve as the lead operational and technical contact for the County; he will provide overall account management, including oversight of the quality of service, pricing and invoicing.



Personnel Training

Clean Harbors' training program is specifically designed to familiarize all employees with facility license requirements, environmental regulations, the hazards associated with their job responsibilities, and procedures for emergency response. Clean Harbors' management has gone to great lengths to institute rigorous corporate programs regarding health, safety, and compliance issues. Our training program is constantly updated to keep up with changing regulations and to incorporate employee feedback.

All Clean Harbors' employees receive rigorous training in the most sophisticated and advanced techniques for handling toxic materials. Clean Harbors commitment to "learning by doing" utilizes an in-house environmental training center. The training center is fully equipped to accommodate all necessary hazardous waste practice exercises, including training stations for staging mock chemical spills, tank/trailer confined space entry practice, and a maze to simulate the hazards encountered while using a self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA).

Clean Harbors' training curriculum begins with a five day, 40 hour Hazardous Waste Management training program that certifies employees in accordance with OSHA Final Rule 29 CFR Part 1910.120 (e) (3). Field employees participate in at least 12 hours of annual refresher training and site-specific training prior to each job. Clean Harbors utilizes a monthly modular training schedule to meet the annual refresher training requirement.

Note – Any employee working behind the segregation table is required to have OSHA 40 hour training. Any employee involved in the preparation of hazardous material for transport must be trained in and current with DOT 8 hour training.

Chemist Specific Training

All Clean Harbors CleanPack chemists complete a 40-hour lab-packaging course. This course concentrates on chemical segregation, packaging and transportation of both industrial and household waste in compliance with local, State and Federal regulations. Detailed explanations and exercises are provided in the following areas:

- ☐ Basic chemistry principles and chemical hazards
- ☐ EPA designated waste codes
- ☐ Selecting the proper waste code and chemical category for a variety of hazardous wastes
- ☐ Department of Transportation's Driver's Guide to Hazardous Materials which discusses how to select the proper shipping name, chemicals forbidden to transport and materials that must be shipped by themselves
- ☐ Completion of hazardous waste manifest and land disposal restriction notifications forms, bills of lading, TSCA manifests, scintillation fluid forms and waste profiles
- ☐ Proper use of personal protective equipment

- ❑ Procedures to be utilized when sampling drums, testing unknowns and evaluating cylinders
- ❑ Reactive handling and packaging procedures
- ❑ Peroxidizable ethers, water reactives, hydrophobic and hydrophilic compounds, Drug Enforcement Agency regulated compounds, picric acid, and chemicals with a low self accelerating decomposition temperature

Chemists are required to perform a hands-on mock lab pack exercise that requires them to segregate, properly manifest and label waste. The course ends with a second mock lab pack exercise that encompasses all aspects of the training program. Our chemists also participate in a 3 month mentoring program with a senior chemist.

Driver Specific Training

For employees who drive for the company, we have designed a Driver Training Policy and Program, which are structured to provide and maintain drivers with the necessary skills to perform safely and efficiently and to comply with regulatory requirements. Training objectives are met through a combination of initial and refresher training courses.

Upon employment by Clean Harbors, our drivers undergo a 16-hour training course to familiarize them with our policies and procedures. In addition, drivers are required to attend an eight-hour refresher annually. The training course addresses all the items below.

Clean Harbors has a very rigorous evaluation program in place to ensure that the drivers we hire are qualified and experienced in operating the specific type of vehicle for which we have hired them. We require three years of experience and a road test prior to employment and a yearly evaluation of driving skills. We also perform a check on each driver's record prior to employment and annually thereafter.

5 Workplan and Event Details

5.1 Collection Event Procedures

Site Layout

In developing a site layout, Clean Harbors takes into account smooth traffic flow and vehicle unloading, "hot zone" operations, staging of materials and equipment, and health and safety considerations of event personnel and the general public. The final version will be consistent with Clean Harbors' Health and Safety Plan, and the recommendations of the County. All support equipment, supplies and safety equipment will be staged at the site prior to the collection event opening.

The packing area will be covered by portable canopies to act as a sun shield, there will be several of them in place also including the break area. We will utilize 10 mil Visqueen to cover the entire hot zone. Up to two unloading stations will be set up tables to facilitate the sorting and inventorying of chemicals dropped off by the participants. Liquids (30 and 55 gallon) will be staged on pallets for subsequent overpacking into an overpack for shipment. Compatible solids will be packed in cubic yard or cubic meter boxes. Compatible liquids in containers of 5 gallons or less will be overpacked into 55-gallon drums. Material that does not conform to our pre-established waste streams will be segregated and lab packed separately.

Emergency response equipment, decontamination stations and eyewash/shower stations will be placed strategically in the chemical handling area. Absorbent material and spill pillows will be placed around the perimeter of the chemical handling area in case of spillage. The chemical handling area will be taped off with red "Hazardous Materials - Keep Out" delineation tape, and only identified chemical handlers will be allowed in this "hot zone" area.

Signs will be posted in appropriate areas and include the following:

- Traffic pattern for entering and exiting the facility.
- Participants must remain in their vehicles while in the unloading/inventory area.
- No smoking, no eating, no drinking
- Proper personal protection equipment must be worn.
- Eye wash and shower locations
- Emergency air horn locations
- Fire extinguisher locations.

Site Safety Meeting

CH conducts a site safety meeting for all Clean Harbors employees and County Staff that will be onsite during the event. The meeting outlines the Site Specific Health and Safety Plan and provides a summary of all safety issues associated with the collection operations.

Vehicle Unloading

Clean Harbors' operation plan is structured to minimize the time participants must wait for material unloading. Consequently, traffic entering the event grounds will be routed to one of the stations where materials will be quickly unloaded and staged in the appropriate packaging area. A separate route may be constructed for immediate vehicle routing to an appropriate

decontamination/handling area should a participant arrive with leaking containers.

Clean Harbors will perform on site pickups as necessary when scheduled and approved by CAC.

Drummed liquids and large containers of dry material will be unloaded from vehicles by forklift and placed onto a Visqueen-covered area in the hot zone after weighing. The area will remain available for continued unloading, as other Clean Harbors handlers will be moving materials away from the unloading area and segregating them by type and size onto pallets. Pallets will be located at the back edge of the Visqueen for ease of subsequent handling.

Identification and Classification

Clean Harbors will be responsible for the proper identification and classification of all waste received. Clean Harbors personnel will identify materials using information obtained from the container type, label and visual inspection. The Farm Chemical Handbook, EPA Pesticide Handbook, Condensed Chemical Dictionary, Merck Index and an EPA list of dioxin precursors will assist in identification.

Clean Harbors will utilize the following methodology to ensure that unknown materials are properly identified. First, a visual inspection will be performed to obtain information from container type and label. Available fragmented information will be referenced to the previously stated references to further identify materials. Second, HazCat analyses will be performed to identify the proper DOT shipping category.

Clean Harbors utilizes streamlined and scaled-down approaches to rapidly identify chemical characteristics to meet the DOT requirements and the profiling requirements of the treatment facility. Standard HazCat tests are corrosivity, flammability, oxidizing potential, reactivity, peroxide screen, cyanide screen, and sulfide screen. Clean Harbors personnel have extensive training and experience performing HazCat analyses in the field and have developed additional field test methods used to screen for other compounds such as halogenated compounds and phenols to further identify agricultural chemical types.

Overpacking of Pesticides, Herbicides and Fungicides

All eligible solid materials will be overpacked in DOT approved cubic yard boxes or 55 gallon drums for incineration. Bulk solids will be broken down into appropriate size charges for facility acceptance. Lead arsenate cannot be incinerated but can be stabilized and landfilled. All eligible liquid materials will be overpacked in poly or steel DOT containers. Bulk drums or semi-bulks will be overpacked or transferred into new drums for safe transportation to the Clean Harbors disposal facility.

Material that does not meet our pre-established bulk streams profile will be labpacked. Labpacking will follow guidelines approved by the DOT and EPA in 40 CFR Part 265.316, as well as specific disposal requirements of the final disposal facilities. A material drum inventory sheet has columns for reporting labpack drum contents. The drum inventory sheet will remain on a clipboard attached to the partially filled drums and inside the lid on packed drums awaiting final inspection by the Chemist. The labpacking will begin with the most hazardous materials, as requested by the Chemist.

Consolidation of Pesticides, Herbicides and Fungicides

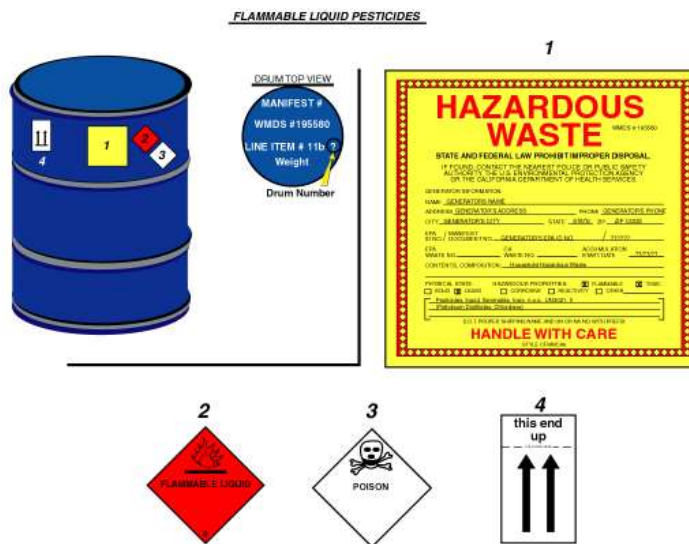
During collection activities, drummed liquids will be staged in the consolidation area according to hazard class and compatibility (such as carbamates, organophosphates, organochlorine, etc.). After all waste material is accepted and the site is closed to the public, Clean Harbors will overpack the waste collected into DOT approved drums for disposal.

Labeling

Labeling will be in compliance with 40 CFR Part 273, 49 CFR Part 172 and the designated facility requirements. All containers will be properly labeled, marked and weighed prior to staging the material for transportation.

Labels and markings would include:

- EPA hazardous waste label
- DOT hazard class, if warranted
- Drum inventory sheet, if warranted
- This side up, if warranted
- Drum I.D., including profile and manifest number



Manifesting

Clean Harbors will manifest the material at each collection event using appropriate shipping papers to the Treatment, Storage, Disposal Facility (TSDF) in accordance with 40 CFR Part 273 and the Department of Transportation HM-181 and 215a regulations.

Transportation Off-Site

All waste will be transported off-site at the conclusion of the event. Transportation vehicles will be loaded with waste materials using a forklift. Subsequent to signing the manifest(s), the vehicle will be checked to ensure that it has been appropriately placarded and is in full compliance with 49 CFR Part 172 and all applicable DOT regulations. Clean Harbors will have appropriate placarding material on hand to cover any placarding requirements.

Site Restoration

Following removal of the packaged materials, plastic covering from the ground and the tables will be packed into drums for disposal. Though not anticipated, any contaminated soil generated as a result of the on-site operations will be properly packaged and disposed of at the appropriate facility. Safety equipment (coveralls, gloves, aprons, etc.) will likewise be drummed for disposal. The site will be cleared of all the equipment and restored to its original condition.

Documentation and Reporting

Clean Harbors will profile and manifest the material to the appropriate TSDF using the Department of Transportation HM-181 and 215a regulations. A computer used in the field

performs Clean Harbors' existing documentation system completely electronically. All documents and communication for their activities are dated and logged electronically on computer spreadsheets. This tracking system is continually reviewed to ensure traceability to the event and that both the client and the proper regulatory agency are contacted.

The event information will be readily available from Clean Harbors computerized WIN system (Waste Information Network), information in the system includes :
