Fall prevention Program	First responders and emergency medical services (EMS) now see more older adult fall victims than fire victims, often being called to the same homes repeatedly for minor falls. The utilization of EMS for lift assists is costly and diverts care from higher acuity-related calls that need immediate triage and transport to care. It also presents a window into a person's life that may not be visible to non-resident family members and health care providers. The reliance on EMS to respond to resident falls presents a unique opportunity for VCAAA to work in tandem with EMS for first responders to offer resources and education to the older adult to prevent future falls, which in turn can reduce repeat visits for falls-related care and free up scarce resources to respond to emergency calls.
