Discussion:

The Bringing Families Home (BFH) program, created by Assembly Bill (AB) 1603 (Chapter 25, Statutes of 2016), is intended to help reduce the number of families in the child welfare system experiencing homelessness, increase family reunification, and prevent foster care placements. HSA is preparing a grant application to submit to CDSS for BFH services. HSA's Children and Family Services department, in partnership with HSA's Adult and Family Services-Homeless Services program, by utilizing Homeless Services Social Workers, will offer case management services to help eligible families secure and stabilize housing. Program details are currently being developed along with the program budget, a substantial portion of which will be dedicated to direct rental assistance for families. It is anticipated that over a three-year period, HSA will be requesting up to \$961,950 in grant funding. If awarded, HSA will return to your Board with full program details, which may include the request for new staff positions, and to accept any funding associated with this program. Attached as Exhibit 1 is an All County Letter announcing the program.

We request that your Board authorize HSA to submit a grant application to CDSS by the deadline of October 31, 2019, for the Bringing Families Home program.

This request is consistent with County Strategic Plan Focus Area #4: Community Well-Being, Strategic Goal #3: Ensure that children at risk receive the best treatment services to achieve the greatest success. Board of Supervisors October 22, 2019 Page 3
