Dear Supervisor,

I urge you to reject the proposed ordinance on Tuesday that would shut down oil and gas drilling and unnecessarily rewrite the current county oil and gas permitting process.

This ordinance would stop the County Planning Division from issuing any permits for new oil and gas wells or the re-drilling of existing wells and would give the Board of Supervisors discretionary power over approvals. This measure effectively shuts down the local oil and gas industry in Ventura County — threatening jobs for working families and vital community tax revenues for education and public safety.

Supervisor Bennett asserts oil and gas activities are impacting water supplies in the Oxnard Oil Field. The United States Geological Survey study on the Oxnard Plain, however, did not identify any safety risks, and in fact explicitly stated that their study did not conclude oil field activity was the cause.

It is expensive to live in California and this proposal will hit the income of people who are left in the County who depend on income from this field. California needs to be mindful of the big picture. Regulations are already in place to insure the safety of this asset. CA also uses a great deal of energy - we have to drive long distances to work and often due to the high price of rent or if we are lucky a mortgage.

As you know, oil and gas permit applications are submitted to the planning department for consideration and undergo a rigorous vetting and approval process. This is in addition to the over 25 local, state, and federal agencies that oversee oil and gas production activities. Local oil and gas producers operate under the most stringent safety, labor and environmental standards in the world. The system works and strikes a balance between protecting the environment and allowing the industry to produce the energy California needs right here in Ventura County.

I strongly encourage you to vote NO on this harmful ordinance and protect jobs for working families. Are you supporting this idea to gain votes? I have to wonder when the facts would say you are ignoring the strong evidence and multiple agencies who already have jurisdiction.
