

BY THE NUMBERS:

- **379** Total first gen, Latino student graduates
- **750+** Total students who have completed the program
- **100** High school student interns each year
- **52** First gen students each year
- **100** Percent listing job skills from WFC they are still using after high school- Empathy/social awareness, public speaking, communication, medical skills, interviewing, managerial, etc.
- **23** Percent went to community college or trade school
- 77 Percent went to 4-year college
