
of a child's brain development happens before age 5

Ventura County Kids

16% of kids live in poverty 75% of families need licensed child care but it is unavailable

Y% of kids 1-2 are reported for abuse or neglect

37% of kids 3-5 are not enrolled in preschool or kindergarten

60% of third graders do not read at grade level

About First 5 Ventura County

Proposition 10 passed by voters in 1998!

- 50 cent tax on tobacco products
- Comprehensive system of care: prenatal to age 5
- Innovative programs

\$195 Million invested in Ventura County's Children





- Home Visiting


