Exhibit 8 – Response to Public Comments received prior to the release of the Environmental Document **Response:** There are thirty-eight single family dwellings located about 700 feet south from the proposed wireless communications lease area. This comment does not provide any specific information regarding why the design or location of the proposed communication facility are inappropriate or unlawful. Thus, no specific response is possible.

# B. Email from Billy Taylor, dated 9-23-14

B-1 Regarding: Opposition to the project and location of the proposed wireless communications facility. Proposed facility is "an unnecessary and unsightly addition to the delicate natural landscape and habitat."

Response: Installation of the proposed facility would not result in significant impacts on biological resources (including habitat) as it is located adjacent to an orchard in an area with only sparse native vegetation. The antenna structure is designed as a faux palm tree and would be located adjacent to existing palm trees. Public views from U.S. 101 and public areas in the Rincon Point community would not be substantially altered.

B-2 Regarding: Coverage in the Rincon Point Area is adequate and there is no need for another facility.

Response: Section 704(a) of the 1996 federal Telecommunications Act prohibits local government from unreasonable discrimination among providers of functionally equivalent services. Local governments cannot prohibit personal wireless services and cannot prohibit the siting of wireless facilities on the basis of potential health effects of radio frequency emissions to the extent the regulated services and facilities comply with regulations of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).

The applicant demonstrated that there is a gap in wireless service (i.e. a gap in Verizon coverage). According to the federal Telecommunications Act, the local land use authority (Ventura County) must allow that gap to be filled. The proposed facility has been found consistent with applicable regulations including the Ventura County Coastal Zoning Ordinance, the Ventura County General Plan, and the Ventura County Coastal Area Plan.

We are writing to register our strong objections to the proposed introduction of a wireless communication tower on the bluff overlooking Rincon Point. We are opposed to the project on both aesthetic and public health grounds:

AESTHETIC: Those of us who are lucky enough to live at Rincon Point prize it for the exceptional natural beauty of the view-sheds --ocean, islands and the beautiful slopes of Rincon Mountain and the historic Rincon del Mar ranch. To diminish these view-sheds is to diminish our enjoyment and our considerable property values.

We feel that the introduction of a "faux pine tree" cell tower is a desecration of the ridge-line view from Rincon toward the slopes of the Rincon del Mar. We were under the impression that the Coastal Act protected against this kind of intrusion so near the coast.

Australian study found that children living near TV and FM broadcast towers, which emit similar radiation to cell towers, developed leukemia at three times the rate of children living over seven miles away.

If you live within a quarter mile of a cell phone antenna or tower, you may be at risk of serious harm to your health, according to a German study cited at <a href="www.EMF-Health.com">www.EMF-Health.com</a>, a site devoted to exposing hazards associated with electromagnetic frequencies from cell phone towers and other sources.

Cancer rates more than tripled among people living within 400 meters of cell phone towers or antennas, a German study found. Those within 100 meters were exposed to radiation at 100 times normal levels. An Israeli study found risk of cancer quadrupled among people living within 350 meters (1,148 feet) of a cell phone transmitter—and seven out of eight cancer victims were women. Both studies focused only on people who had lived at the same address for many years.

Other studies have found that levels of radiation emitted from cell phone towers can damage cell tissues and DNA, causing miscarriage, suppressing immune function, and causing other health problems.

Astoundingly, the federal government does not allow rejection of a cell phone tower based on health risks, according to a 2005 article. A Google search found no evidence that this situation has changed.

Yet over 1.9 million cell phone towers and antennae have been approved nationwide without federal studies to assure safety of those living nearby.

In Sweden, the government requires interventions to protect the public from electromagnetic frequencies. Why isn't the U.S. government paying attention to this potential risk to public safety?
