Ratification of, approval of, and authorization for the VCBH Director or designee to sign the State of California Standard Agreement #14-90115 Amendment A02 for substance use disorder (SUD) services with the DHCS (Exhibit 1), increasing the agreement by \$3,207,494 for the period July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016, and the three-year (FY 2014-15 through FY 2016-17) total maximum amount from \$24,806,594 to \$28,014,088.

DISCUSSION:

The State DHCS multi-year Standard Agreement is the established mechanism that allows the County to receive Federal and State allocated funds for Substance Use Disorder (SUD) services provided by community-based providers and County staff. The County uses these funds to support a wide variety of services, such as individual and group treatment, day treatment, parenting skills training for adults and adolescents, short and long-term residential recovery, early intervention, prevention, and education programs, including County-operated and sub-contracted programs, modalities, and services. For the Drug Medi-Cal (DM/C) funding component, community-based organizations that are certified by the State DHCS as DM/C providers contract with the County which acts as a pass-through entity for related federal and state funding. Periodically, the Agreement is amended to account for unexpended state funds reallocated from prior years, and/or to increase/decrease DM/C allocations determined by an updated projection of units of service provided throughout the year.

Under realignment, the Fiscal Year (FY) 2011-12 state budget and accompanying law (Chapter 40, Statutes of 2011 [Assembly Bill (AB) 118] and Chapter 13, Statutes of 2011, First Extraordinary Session [ABX1 16]) moved funding for SUD programs from

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the State to local governments to meet local community needs and priorities. The County of Ventura now receives funding for its SUD services through two allocation methods---the State DHCS Agreement (SAPT Block Grant and D/MC) and realignment funding (instead of direct allocation).

VCBH recommends ratification, approval, and authorization for the VCBH Director or designee to sign the State of California Standard Agreement #14-90115 Amendment A02 for SUD services with the State DHCS, increasing the agreement by \$3,207,494 for the period July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016, and the three-year (FY 2014-15 through FY 2016-17) total maximum amount from \$24,806,594 to \$28,014,088.
