Discussion:

The Stream Gauge Monitoring and Sediment Measuring Program began in 1968 as a joint effort between the District and the USGS. This cooperative program provides valuable stream flow stage (depth), data, rating curves, and sediment loading information that supports the District's watershed planning and monitoring efforts. The program is renewed annually through a JFA between the USGS and the District.

The attached JFA provides for the continuation of the Stream Gauge Monitoring and Sediment Measuring Program for November 1, 2015, to October 31, 2016. For this period, USGS will contribute \$14,400 while the District contributes \$66,500.

For the previous year, USGS contributed \$18,250, and the District contributed \$105,250. However, the costs have been significantly reduced this year by eliminating the sediment measuring program portion of the contract.
