### Reason for Ratification:

The California Department of Social Services on September 30, 2009 released the CalWORKs allocation table indicating that the amount for the Cal Learn Program in Ventura County was \$449,419 for the 2009-2010 Fiscal Year. HSA and VCPH revised the current MOU to increase funding to VCPH by \$130,039 for a total of \$449,419 to administer the Cal Learn program. The increased funding is to hire a Fixed Term Public Health Social Worker II and Office Assistant III to meet the demands of the work requirements and meet the increased case load.

#### **Discussion:**

HSA is responsible for administering the Cal Learn program pursuant to the provisions of Senate Bills 35 and 1078 (Chapters 69 and 1252, Statutes of 1993) and as later modified by California Work Opportunities and Responsibilities to Kids (CalWORKs) welfare reform in 1997. HSA receives an annual CalWORKs single allocation from the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) which includes an allocation of funds for the Cal Learn program. Cal Learn is a mandatory program designed to ensure that eligible teenage parents and pregnant teens under 19 who are on welfare enroll in school and obtain a high school diploma or its equivalent. VCPH operates the Adolescent Family Life Programs (AFLP) which provides intensive case management and health services consistent with those required for the Cal Learn Program. VCPH has administered the Cal Learn Program for HSA in accordance with AFLP standards and scope of work through a written agreement since 1994.

The main goal of the Cal Learn program is to have at least 70% of registered participants enroll and attend school to complete high school or obtain a GED. Measurable outcomes will include:

- Increase school enrollment/graduation/GED
- Increase healthy birth outcomes
- Reduce repeat teen births
- Increase number of self-sufficient teen parents with healthy children
- Increase number of teen parents that make healthy life-style choices.

Revenue and Appropriations of \$319,380 were included in the 2009-2010 Fiscal Year Adopted Budget for the Cal Learn Program. This Board Letter will increase funding by \$130,039 to a total of \$449,419 for the 2009-2010 Fiscal Year.
