Good evening, I hope this email finds you both doing well. First off, thank you for the opportunity for Naval Base Ventura County to review on Ventura County-Initiated Amendments to Article 7, Section 8107-5 of the Ventura County Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance (NCZO) and Article 5, Section 8175-5.7 of the Ventura County Coastal Zoning Ordinance (CZO), to Modify Permit Requirements for Certain New Oil and Gas Exploration and Production Operations and to Address the Applicability of the County's Oil Development Regulations.

A quick introduction to you, my name is Kendall Lousen and I'm the *Community Planning Liaison Officer* for Naval Base Ventura County (NBVC). I'm writing to you this evening to call attention to County Planning Staff to address our comments (denoted below) to ensure NBVC's military readiness operations are protected and will not be impacted by the County Planning Commissioner's decision; and with that, we kindly request Staff to revise the Planning Commission Staff Report and Exhibits 2-21 before Commissioners vote to adopt Agenda Item #7 [Case Number PL20-0052] at the 7/30 Planning Commission Hearing Agenda.

- It appears on Exhibit 2-9, NBVC (Point Mugu Base, Port Hueneme Base, and Laguna Peak) is annexed into the Maps of Project Areas – Applicable to NCZO and CZO areas in unincorporated Ventura County, which needs to be corrected prior to Planning Commissioners adopt Agenda Item #7 (Case Number: PL20-0052).
- We request County Staff to correct all Maps of Project Areas exhibits by removing NBVC military operational footprint (Point Mugu, Port Hueneme, and Laguna Peak) from the Project Area for the proposed amendments to NCZO and CZO areas for Oil Development Permitting Regulations in County of Ventura. If no correction are made to the Maps of Projects Areas, this would suggest NBVC military base footprint and operations are subject to the County zoning ordinance procedures, including a requirement for NBVC to conform to the proposed NCZO and CZO amendments for all Oil Development Operations for the County of Ventura.
- The proposed zoning amendments to Article 7, Section 8107-5 of the Ventura County Non-Coastal Zoning Ordinance (NCZO) and Article 5, Section 8175-5.7 of the Ventura County Coastal Zoning Ordinance (CZO) suggest NBVC Point Mugu, Port Hueneme, and Laguna Peak are public property that will become available to the County of Ventura to establish oil and gas exploration and production operations if Commissioners adopt the proposed Oil Development Regulations for NCZO and CZO unincorporated areas of Ventura County.
- We recommend the County to remove NBVC (Point Mugu, Port Hueneme) from Exhibit 2 and other references provided for Agenda Item #7 Case Number PL20-0052, to ensure NBVC military readiness operations and activities are precluded to comply with the County's Oil Development Regulations/Discretionary Permitting Requirements for new and existing oil and gas exploration and production operations in the NCZO and CZO unincorporated areas of Ventura County.

Again, thank you for your time and welcoming NBVC the opportunity to review and provide our comments to Ventura County Planning Staff. We look forward to seeing updated staff report and revised exhibits illustrating updated map project areas.
