Dear Ventura County Supervisors,

I'm writing in support of efforts to amend the County's Zoning Ordinances so that your Planning Division and the public will have better oversight over new oil wells and facilities.


I have travelled to Mozambique, Africa, where most citizens do not have access to safe drinking water due to a broken infrastructure. I was asked by women walking down the road for a drink of water from the water bottle I was carrying.

My experience is dire. Unintended consequences for our water and soil are similarly evident however, when unregulated actors are potentially contaminating water sources for communities surrounding the Los Padres National Forest.

In Ventura County, thousands of oil wells operate under antiquated permits, and more continue to be drilled without an evaluation of environmental impacts and little to no consideration of nearby natural resources and communities. Antiquated permits present a grave risk to the environment, our climate, precious water supplies, and public health.

All new wells in Ventura County should abide by the same modern standards. Oil companies must not be allowed to drill an unlimited number of wells, for an unlimited amount of time, and without an evaluation of impacts on public health and the environment.

Please vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance to ensure that new wells and facilities under antiquated permits are subject to environmental review and public notice and hearings.
