



State Blueprint for a Safer Economy





Concerns with new State Blueprint:

- Should consider higher testing volumes appropriately

- Should consider treatment success/mortality metrics
- Should allow for local County discretion
- Should consider high business compliance rates
- Should treat local incarceration positive cases like state/federal

Schools Status

 26 School re-opening waivers have been submitted in Ventura County, 21 have been approved, 5 under review

New state blueprint for reopening:

Evaluation only.

 Does not change school waiver process for reopening in-person instruction for counties in 'wides free of risk tier (Ventura County is currently in this tier)
- Does not change guidance for Small Cohorts/Groups of Children and Youth released on August 25th
- Schools will be eligible for reopening fully for in-person instruction following California School Sector Specific Guidelines once the county is off Tier 1 for 14 days

Permitted and Recommended

- Online parties/contests (e.g. costume or pumpkin carving)
- Pumpkin picking at pumpkin patches (use hand sanitizer or wash hands
- with soap and water before and after)

 - Drive by events or contests where individuals dress up or decorate their vehicles and drive by "judges" that are appropriately physically distanced.

 - c. Drive in events where individuals can receive a treat bag (limited to commercially packaged non-perishable treats) or take away item from an organizer while the participants remain in their vehicle.


Fall Activities Guidance

Not Permitted (gatherings and events are not currently allowed under the Health Officer Order)

- Halloween gatherings, events or parties with non-household members are not permitted even if they are conducted outdoors.
- Carnivals réastivals it live entertainment and Equetad dans entertainne not allowed.

- Door to door trick or treating is not allowed because it can be very difficult to maintain proper social distancing on porches and at front doors, ensure that everyone answering or coming to the door is appropriately masked to prevent disease spread, and because sharing food is risky.
- "Trunk or treating" where children go from car to car instead of door to door to receive treats is also not allowed, particularly when part of Halloween events, since it is difficult to avoid crowding and sharing food.




Daily Case Rate Per 100,000 Population for Ventura County - June 1 to Sept 5*** GOAL = 7 or less

COVID-19 Testing Activities & Flu Vaccine Roll out

COVID-19 Testing Summary:

- 169,186 Total Individuals Tested
- 220.1 per 100,000 7-day Average (State Average 217)
- Total number of individuals tested has decreased by 28.8% from the prior week


- Flu vaccine is available throughout the community
- Public Health and Network of Partners to preform focused targeted distribution (49 Events have been scheduled)

COVID-19 Vaccine Status:

- No reliable vaccine has completed all the trail phases.
- Access and distribution of a viable vaccine is unknown (earliest November/December to next spring).
- Distribution and priority most likely will be directed by the CDC and the State.

Evacuation Terminology Changes

- Cal OES law enforcement branch convened a team of representatives from across California to review evacuation terminology.
- Depending on the jurisdiction only. terminology may 2004 differents e Pty Ltd.
- In Ventura County, we used the terms "Mandatory" and "Voluntary" to describe our evacuations perimeters during an incident.

Evacuation Terminology - New Language

- Evacuation Order (Old term: Mandatory Evacuation)
 - Threat is imminent and the Conditions exist that SERIOUSLY IMPERIL or ENDANGER the lives of those in the defined

- Evacuation Warning (Old term: Voluntary Evacuation)
 - Threat to lives in not yet imminent but residents should begin preparing to leave.



How Evacuation Information is Communicated

- VC Alert Most efficient and effective
- Door-to-door notifications by law enforcement personnel Evaluation only.
- Use of public address systems from patros vehicles • Emergency Alert System
- - Interrupts TV & Radio broadcasts
- Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA)
 - Notifications are sent to all cell phones in a geographic area
