## Response to Recommendation R-05

The District Attorney's Office has:

1. obtained a certified translation of the pertinent language in simplified Chinese from the Office of the Attorney General,
2. contacted the designer of the poster currently utilized and the designer has agreed to redesign the poster to include simplified Chinese, and
3. contacted the Ventura County Sheriff's Office and secured a commitment by that office to cover the printing costs of the new posters with grant funds.

The District Attorney's Office estimates the new posters will be available for distribution in approximately 90 days.
