Dear Ventura County Board of Supervisors,

I am writing to urge you to continue to protect our our freedom and privacy and want to make sure my voice is heard that my husband and I feel very strongly that we should not be coerced by businesses to show vaccination cards or passports.

The CDC shows on this link <https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#datatracker-home> the death rate so incredibly low, and both cases and death rate decreasing with only a little above half the population being vaccinated. The numbers show how unnecessary vaccination cards and passports are science wise. This is without even touching on the violation these "papers" would be on our constitutional rights.

Herd immunity may be achieved by both vaccinations and natural immunity (prior infections). As a result of the increased herd immunity in the county there is an extremely low risk of infection and hospitalization. Based on the County data, it is time for the County to declare the state of emergency is over.

Also, there is a vast array of evidence in the scientific literature that shows definitively that if you have had Covid it's very unlikely that you'll be reinfected and you will be protected from infection. Thus a vaccination is an unnecessary risk for those with natural immunity.
