The proposed **Digital Vaccine Passport** is an instrument of totalitarian social control, invasion of privacy and discrimination.

The COVID Vaccine as indicated by the CDC does not meet the technical definition of a vaccine because it does not prevent transmission of disease or illness, but is only to reduce symptoms of illness.

So, the reason for a vaccine passport therefore is control, forced compliance, divisiveness and invasion of medical privacy, Put another way, it will create a caste system; how is it that working for India? How will society benefit from more division when we are already struggling with race issues?

We do not and will not consent to the use of a digital vaccination passport for Ventura County in order for citizens to engage in lawful commerce or to participate in normal social activities.

Allowing or encouraging businesses and clubs to discriminate by creating a two-tier society where unvaccinated people are barred from participating in civic society is blatantly unconstitutional and discriminatory.

It is the government's duty to protect the Constitutional rights of *all* Americans in this county.

Further social division can devolve to justifying horrific human rights abuses. Discrimination created by the passports will lead society into a downward spiral, which we need to stop before its too late.

Note that the covid vaccines are not yet FDA approved; people need freedom of choice to consider the risks involved with vaccine injuries and side effects;

Even if people are in favor of taking them, its far too early to mandate these injections with a passport without FDA approval.

There are multiple religious objections for many regarding the substances contained in the injections ; citizens should not be forced out of society and normal commerce or to be forced to compromise their deeply held religious beliefs; this is dangerously unconstitutional.
