Subject: Agenda Item #33 on 5/18/21 Supervisors Meeting: Approval of and Authorization for the County Executive Officer to Sign an Agreement between the County and the Ventura County Community Foundation in an Amount Not to Exceed \$262,500 for Vaccination Outreach and Educational Services and Expenses

It has been just 4 months that the Covid-19 “vaccine” has been available to the general public. What we now know about this experimental protocol is disturbing. It is irresponsible and negligent of Ventura County to make any effort or devote any funding to promoting something that is highly suspect and could pose severe health issues or even death.

Here is what we know today:
