Sufficient appropriations are available in the FY 2021-22 Road Fund Adopted Budget. Sufficient revenue and appropriations will be included in the FY 2022-23 through FY 2024-25 Road Fund Budgets as appropriate.

Discussion:

The ATP is a grant/reimbursement program developed by the California Transportation Commission (CTC) and administered by the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans). On March 25, 2020, Caltrans announced a Call for Projects for ATP Cycle 5 funds. As authorized by your Board on July 28, 2020, Public Works Agency Roads & Transportation (PWA-RT) submitted three applications for grant funding consideration in both statewide and local competitions.

On April 13, 2021, your Board approved receiving \$6,195,000 in statewide ATP funding for the El Rio Pedestrian Improvement and Safe Routes to School project. The \$1,103,000 Santa Rosa Bike Lane Improvement project was not approved at the state level but was approved for a reduced reimbursement level at the MPO level by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) on the condition that PWA-RT fund the remaining project costs.

PWA-RT is approved to receive \$330,000 for the Santa Rosa Road Bike Lane Improvement project. The project will construct 6.8 lane miles of Class II bike lane with a 2 ft. buffer and rumble strips and over 900 ft. of sidewalk along Santa Rosa Road to provide safe route to schools from Hidden Meadows Estates to Santa Rosa Technology Magnet School. The ATP grant will fund a portion of the bike lane and the pedestrian improvements, with the General Fund Assigned Bike Lane Project Fund Balance supporting the Road Fund for the remaining non-ATP funded bike lane.
