## Background

- County Tree Protection Ordinance and Guidelines adopted in 1992- offsets required for altering or removing Protected Trees
- **Tree Protection Ordinance:** "Ventura County recognizes that trees contribute significantly to the • County's unique aesthetic, biological, cultural, and historical environment as well as its air quality" (Sec. 8107-25.1)
- Tree Mitigation Fund Distribution Program approved by your Board on December 17, 2013
- General Plan Policy COS-1.15 (Countywide Tree Planting): "The County shall establish and support a countywide target for the County, cities in Ventura County, agencies, organizations, businesses, and citizens to plant two million trees throughout the County by 2040."
- General Plan/Climate Action Plan (CAP) Implementation Program COS-H (County Tree Planting  $\bullet$ **Program):** "The County shall plant at least one thousand trees annually." CEO Sustainability Division and sustainability committee will provide oversight of CAP implementation programs.




# Current Distribution Program

- Projects shall include the planting and maintenance of newly planted trees •
- Eligible locations: Within County, on land publicly-owned, owned by conservation agency, or • protected by conservation easement (on land suitable for long-term survival of trees)
- Eligible organizations: Non-profit conservation organizations and public agencies based in County
- <u>Project reporting:</u> Tree Maintenance and Monitoring Plan, with regular progress reports

### **Eligibility/Selection Criteria**

- County-owned properties within incorporated areas will be eligible for funding
- An organization is no longer required to have membership of at least 500 individuals or businesses, but must have owned or managed natural resource property for at least three years
- Selection criteria for project proposals will include points for demonstration of lacksquarewater availability (esp. reclaimed water)

### **Project Initiation/Monitoring**


- All trees must be planted within the first year of a project
- The minimum monitoring period will be reduced from seven to five years



- Existing program awards 30 of 100 selection points to proposed projects which include: public access, oak woodland restoration, or other habitat preservation and/or restoration benefits
- County Policy (April 27, 2021): Protect Monarch Butterfly Overwintering Groves and Support Planting of Native Milkweed and Pollinator-Friendly Plants on County Property Where Practicable
- Monarch butterfly habitat restoration will be specifically encouraged for the next  $\bullet$ distribution round
- For monarch habitat restoration: restoration site must be suitable, and a habitat assessment and restoration plan must be conducted



• Protected Tree species <u>other than oaks and sycamores</u> may be planted outside Scenic Resource Protection Overlay zones

# CEQA Compliance

### **Exempt from California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) review,** pursuant to CEQA Guidelines:

- Section 15307 (Actions by Regulatory Agencies for Protection of Natural Resources): Action taken by a regulatory agency, as authorized by state or local ordinance, "to assure the maintenance, restoration, or enhancement of a natural resource where the regulatory process involves procedures for protection of the environment."
- Section 15308 (Actions by Regulatory Agencies for Protection of the Environment): Action taken by a regulatory agency, as authorized by state or local ordinance, "to assure the maintenance, restoration, enhancement, or protection of the environment where the regulatory process involves procedures for protection of the environment."



# **Recommended** Actions

- 1. RECEIVE staff presentation on the Planning Division's Proposed Tree Mitigation Fund Distribution Program;
- 2. DETERMINE that the proposed revisions to the Tree Mitigation Fund Distribution Program and implementation of the program as set forth in this Board letter are categorically exempt from environmental review pursuant to sections 15307 and 15308 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, and that no unusual circumstance or other exceptions set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 preclude the applicability of these categorical exemptions;
- **3. APPROVE** the Planning Division's proposed revisions to the Tree Mitigation Fund Distribution Program as set forth in this Board letter;
- 4. AUTHORIZE the RMA Purchasing Agent to execute contracts for each program award on a form approved by County Counsel; and
- 5. AUTHORIZE the Auditor-Controller to process the accounting transactions necessary to establish appropriations and unanticipated revenue as follows (requires 4/5<sup>th</sup> vote):

INCREASE 2910-2911 Services and Supplies \$928,000 INCREASE 2910-2911 Licenses, Permits and Franchises \$928,000
