DISCUSSION:

Your Board adopted Ordinance 4399, separating the Office of Public Administrator and Public Guardian (PAPG) from the Office of Treasurer-Tax Collector, effective March 26, 2009. Subsequently, PAPG has continued to occupy the same work area in the Treasurer-Tax Collector's section at the Hall of Administration. This work area is situated between the Tax Collector side of operations and the Treasury side of operations. It is expected that in December 2009, PAPG will complete their relocation to another building. At that time, the space that they are vacating will be available for reassignment to another agency.

The Treasury provides a service for County agencies and qualifying government entities to deposit cash and checks from their daily operations for investment purposes. To maintain controls over the safeguarding of these assets, it is recommended that the Treasury move into the area vacated by PAPG. This area is in proximity to the vault located in the Tax Collector's side of operations which will enable staff to handle deposits within a single secured perimeter and with less exposure to risks. This move will also make available valuable stand-alone Main Plaza space of approximately 1184 square feet for use by another County operation.

In accordance with Government Code 27013, the actual administrative cost of the Treasury operations is reimbursable from the treasury pool of investments effectively spreading that cost among all of the participating public agencies. The requested appropriations will be recovered through the normal reimbursement process.
