#### DISCUSSION:

In April 2004 your Board gave approval to apply for the Per Capita Grant Program and the Roberti-Z'Berg-Harris (RZH) Block Grant Program under the California Clean Water, Clean Air, Safe Neighborhood Parks, and Coastal Protection Bond Act of 2002 (Prop 40). On February 28, 2006 your Board approved the Prop 40 project list with allocations to specific park projects throughout the county. To date, all funds have been spent except \$413,000 of the original balance of \$1,218,975; these funds must be spent (invoiced) by December 31, 2010 to be guaranteed final payment by the State.

Of the available funds, \$163,000 is programmed for El Rio Park and Community Center and \$250,000 is programmed for Piru trail. A letter dated March 18, 2010 from the State Office of Grants and Local Services (OGALS) recently reminded the County that the above fund balance remains to be allocated. The current Piru trail project timeline for completion will not meet the above deadline requirements. Parks Department has shovel ready projects at both Tapo Canyon and Toland parks that these funds could be applied to in order to meet the filing deadline. The Tapo Canyon project would bring needed additional use revenue to the enterprise fund.

The Parks Department is requesting that the Board reauthorize the \$250,000 previously allocated for the Piru trail project back to Parks in order to expend the funding before the grant deadline.
