## **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- Ratify, approve, and authorize the submission of the Ventura County Behavioral Health (VCBH) Justice Assistance Grant - Substance Abuse Offender Treatment Program (JAG-OTP) American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) grant application and acceptance of \$953,659 in funding (Exhibit 1) from the California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA), for Alcohol and Drug Treatment Services, for the service period of October 1, 2009 to March 31, 2011.
- 2. Authorize the Auditor-Controller to process the necessary accounting transactions to establish appropriations as follows:

Approve and authorize the Chair of the Board to sign the FY 2009-2010 Sixth Amendments with Khepera House (Exhibit 2) and Prototypes Women's Center (Exhibit 3) for Alcohol and Drug Program Services, Fifth Amendment with Tarzana Treatment Centers for Residential Detoxification Services (Exhibit 4), and Third Amendments with Aegis Medical Systems, Inc. (Exhibit 5) and Western Pacific Med-Corp (Exhibit 6) for Outpatient Narcotic Treatment Services, to increase the maximum contract amounts, for the service period of July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010, in the following amounts:

#### DISCUSSION:

#### Recommendations 1 and 2:

# Ratify, Approve, and Authorize JAG-OTP Grant Application Submission and Grant Funding Acceptance.

The California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA) has awarded Ventura County Behavioral Health (VCBH) \$953,659 in Justice Assistance Grant - Substance Abuse Offender Treatment Program (JAG-OTP) ARRA funding for staffing and support costs related to the assessment, placement, treatment, and supervision of individuals sentenced under Penal Code (PC) section 1210.1 (a six month drug and alcohol treatment program for qualifying drug offenders). The grant period for this funding is October 1, 2009 through March 31, 2011.

Specifically, VCBH will use the JAG-OTP grant funding for the following purposes: (1) provision of residential alcohol and drug treatment services through two existing contract providers (Khepera House and Prototypes Women's Center, (2) offender screening, assessment, and referral services through the Quick Start assessment center co-located in the Hall of Justice, (3) court representation by an Alcohol and Drug Treatment Specialist in a dedicated court room (ADP Court Liaison), (4) support of one Office Assistant III and three Alcohol and Drug Treatment Specialist III full time equivalent positions, and (5) support of program operating expenses (training, travel, supplies, etc.).

The Probation Agency will use the JAG-OTP grant funding to support two Deputy Probation Officer full time equivalent positions. The Deputy Probation Officers will be responsible for assisting offenders' sentenced under PC 1210.1 to maintain sobriety and drug abstinence by monitoring offenders' court-ordered probation terms and conditions and treatment progress.

# **Authorization for Auditor Controller to Establish Appropriations**

To ensure that sufficient appropriations are available to support the JAG-OTP ARRA grant funded activities (described above and in the section below) and budget awarded grant funding, VCBH is recommending that the Board authorize the Auditor Controller's Office to process the necessary accounting transactions to establish appropriations in

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Alcohol and Drug Programs Budget Unit 5150 and Probation Agency Budget Unit 4200 as detailed in Recommendation #2.

#### Recommendations 3 and 4:

# Khepera House and Prototypes Women's Center Sixth Amendments

Khepera House and Prototypes Women's Center provide alcohol and drug program residential services that offer program participants an opportunity to become productive members of the community by assisting the program participants in overcoming their addiction problems and decreasing their criminal activities/involvement. To ensure that a residential alcohol and drug treatment referral option is available for offenders eligible for these services under PC 1210.1 and that additional clients may be served. VCBH recommends approval of the FY 2009-10 Sixth Amendments with Khepera House and Prototypes Women's Center to: (1) augment the Khepera House contract with \$9,450 in new JAG-OTP funding and increase the ADP Residential Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) Discretionary line item by \$56,390 from \$76,200 to \$132,590 and (2) augment the Prototypes Women's Center contract with \$7,200 in new JAG-OTP and \$13,000 in Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) Collaborative Justice Courts Substance Abuse Focus Program grant funding. The Khepera House contract will be increased from \$143,854 to \$209,694 (an increase of \$65,840). This increase will allow for approximately 1,242 more bed days to be made available. The Prototypes Women's Center contract will be increased from \$641,089 to \$661,289 (an increase of \$20,200). This increase will allow for approximately 253 more bed days to be made available. There are no rate changes or other substantive modifications to the agreements.

## **Tarzana Treatment Centers Fifth Amendment**

Tarzana Treatment Centers provides residential detoxification services and is funded with County General Fund and Offender Treatment Program (OTP) funding. VCBH recommends approval of the FY 2009-2010 Fifth Amendment with Tarzana Treatment Centers to augment the contract with \$6,000 in Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Act (SAMHSA) funding, for the service period of October 1, 2009 through September 30, 2010 (federal fiscal year). The new maximum contract amount will be increased from \$162,125 to \$168,125. This increase will allow for approximately 14 more bed days to be made available. There are no rate changes or other substantive modifications to the agreement. Note—While the use of the SAMHSA funding coincides with the federal fiscal year (October 1, 2009 through September 30, 2010), this amendment is for the service period and aligned with the County fiscal year of July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

## Aegis Medical Systems, Inc. and Western Pacific Med-Corp Third Amendments

Aegis Medical Systems, Inc. provides outpatient narcotic treatment program services for adults. This contract is fully funded with Drug Medi-Cal revenue. VCBH recommends approval and authorization for the Chair of the Board to sign the FY 2009-10 Third

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to sign the FY 2009-10 Third Amendments with Aegis Medical Systems, Inc. and Western Pacific Med-Corp to: (1) increase the Aegis Medical Systems, Inc. contract maximum from \$1,493,625 to \$1,795,065 (an increase of \$301,440) and (2) increase the Western Pacific Med-Corp contract maximum from \$607,191 to \$663,051 (an increase of \$55,860) for the service period July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010. Under the prior contract amount with Aegis, either 144,871 methadone doses or 123,644 counseling sessions (10 minute increments) could be provided. For Western Pacific, under the prior contract either 58,893 methadone doses or 50,264 counseling sessions (10 minute increments) could be provided. The proposed contract increase with Aegis will allow for the additional provision of 29,238 daily methadone doses or 24,954 counseling sessions (10 minute increments) and for Western Pacific 5,418 methadone doses or 4,624 counseling sessions (10 minute increments). There are no other rate modifications or substantive changes.

## **Authorization for Auditor Controller to Establish Appropriations**

To ensure that sufficient appropriations are available to support the Khepera House, Aegis Medical Systems, Inc., and Western Pacific Med-Corp contract increases that are recommended above related to the ADP Residential SAPT Discretionary and Drug Medi-Cal funding, VCBH is also recommending that the Board authorize the Auditor Controller to process the necessary accounting transactions to establish appropriations in Alcohol and Drug Programs Budget Unit 5150 as detailed in Recommendation #4.
