Discussion:

On October 28, 2008 the Board of Supervisor approved an Additional Penalty Assessment of two dollars for every ten dollars or fraction thereof, prescribed by Government Code section 76000.5 upon every fine, penalty, or forfeiture imposed and collected by the courts for specified criminal offenses, for deposit into the Emergency Medical Services Fund for distribution and use in accordance with Health and Safety Code section 1797.98a.

The Emergency Medical Services Agency is currently projecting significant increases in Fines, Forfeitures and Penalties. This has resulted from increased fines administered by the court. Court fines are paid to Physician & Hospitals for uncompensated emergency medical care.

The Emergency Medical Services (EMED) Trust account is projected to be \$740,000 over budget. As such, EMED expenditures to physicians and hospitals can be increased accordingly.
