Authorization to Accept the Fiscal Year 2012 Homeland Security Grant Program Award and Authorization for the Auditor-Controller to Increase Appropriations and Unanticipated Revenue. (RECOMMENDATION # 2 REQUIRES 4/5THS VOTE.)

Recommendations:

It is recommended that your Board:

- Authorize the Sheriff's Office to accept the 2012 Homeland Security Grant Program award in the amount of \$679,497 from the California Emergency Management Agency on behalf of the Sheriff's Office, Fire Protection District, Public Health Department – Emergency Medical Services Agency, and other first responder disciplines within the County.
- 2. Authorize the Auditor-Controller to process the necessary accounting transactions to adjust appropriations and unanticipated revenue as follows:

Discussion:

The County of Ventura has been awarded a total of \$679,497 in grant funds from the Fiscal Year 2012 State Homeland Security Grant Program.

Your Board ratified our request to apply on September 11, 2012. An application was submitted on August 17, 2012 and the California Emergency Management Agency approved the application on October 12, 2012. The grant funds will be provided on a reimbursement basis. The performance period began October 12, 2012 and ends May 31, 2014.

The purpose of the State Homeland Security Grant Program is to enhance the capabilities of state and local first responders by allowing for equipment acquisition, planning, exercises, and training. As with previous State Homeland Security funding, grantees are permitted to retain a percentage of the funds for grant administration, which is five percent under the 2012 program. The remaining 95 percent of the funds will be allocated to county and city law enforcement, fire and emergency management agencies, as well as the County's Public Health Department.

The projects that have been approved for funding include the following:

- A multi-agency, multi-disciplinary training and planning team to develop crossdiscipline response plans and training;
- National Incident Management System training;
- Public education campaigns;
- Terrorism Liaison Officer training;
- Bio-surveillance capability enhancement;

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- Maintain cache of nerve agent antidote kits for first responders;
- Physical security enhancements;
- Equipment and training for the regional Urban Search and Rescue Team;
- · Mass care and shelter capability enhancements; and,
- Interoperable communications system exercise.

The Sheriff's Office of Emergency Services (OES) will administer the grant over a 19-month performance period that ends on May 31, 2014. Therefore, OES will retain the administrative allocation of \$33,975 from the grant to cover the personnel costs associated with grant administration. This amount is equal to five percent of the total grant amount, which is the maximum amount allowed for grant administration.

We do not plan to spend the entire award amount this fiscal year. Therefore, we are only asking for appropriations for projects that will be completed before June 30, 2013. The balance of the funds will be appropriated next fiscal year.
