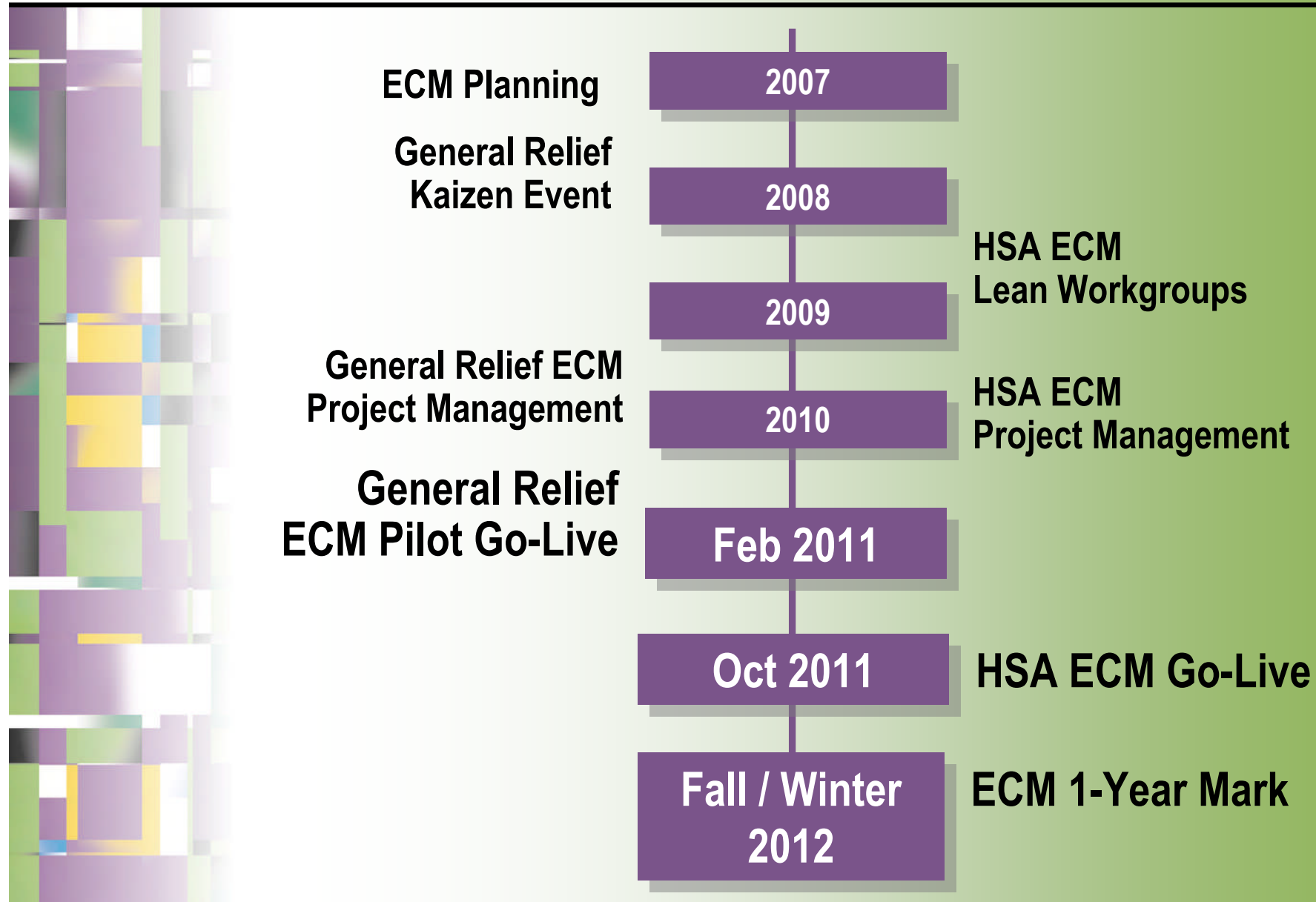

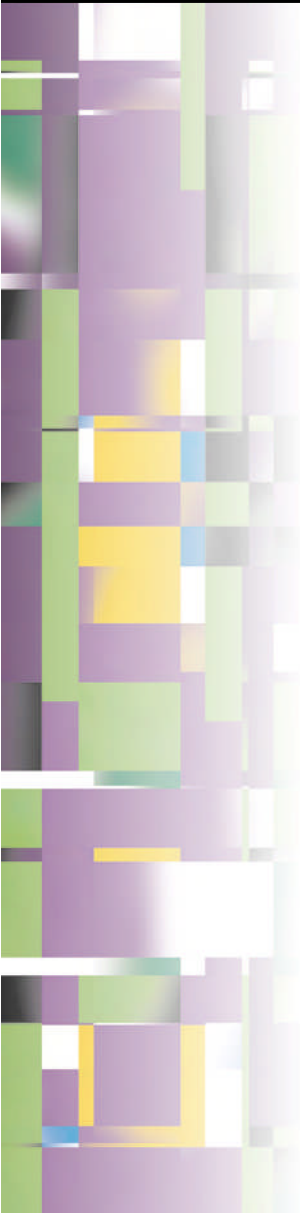

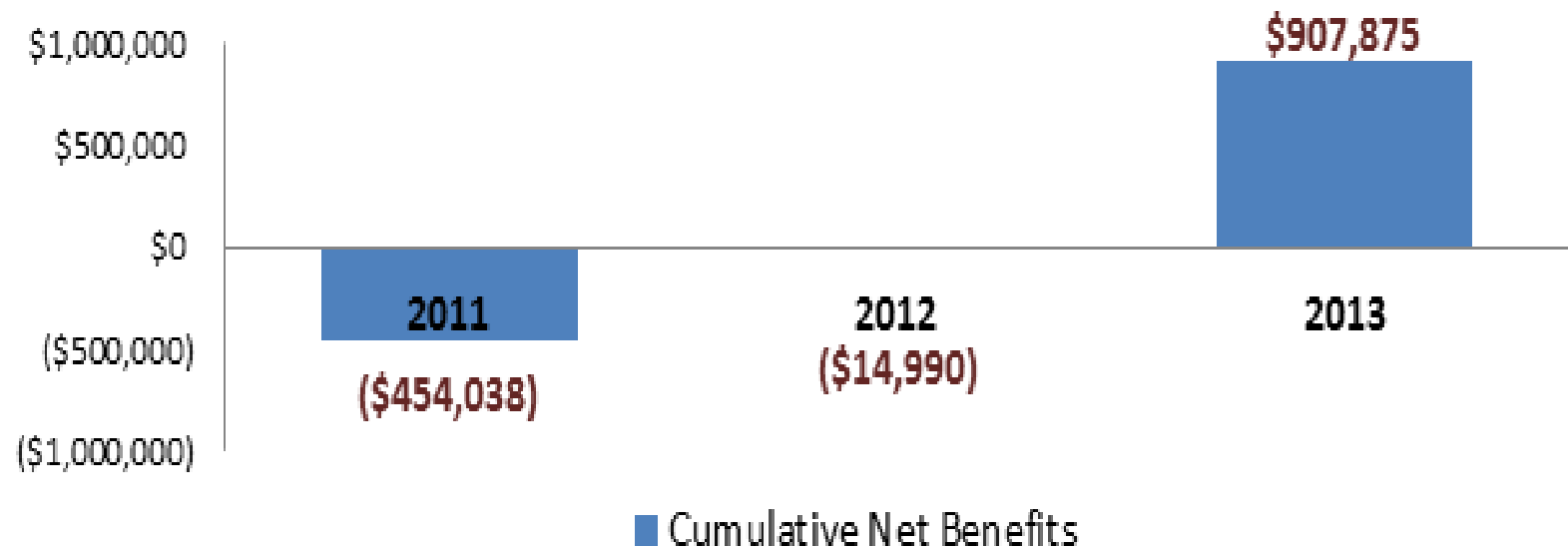
# ECM By the Numbers

# ECM ROI: Three-Year View

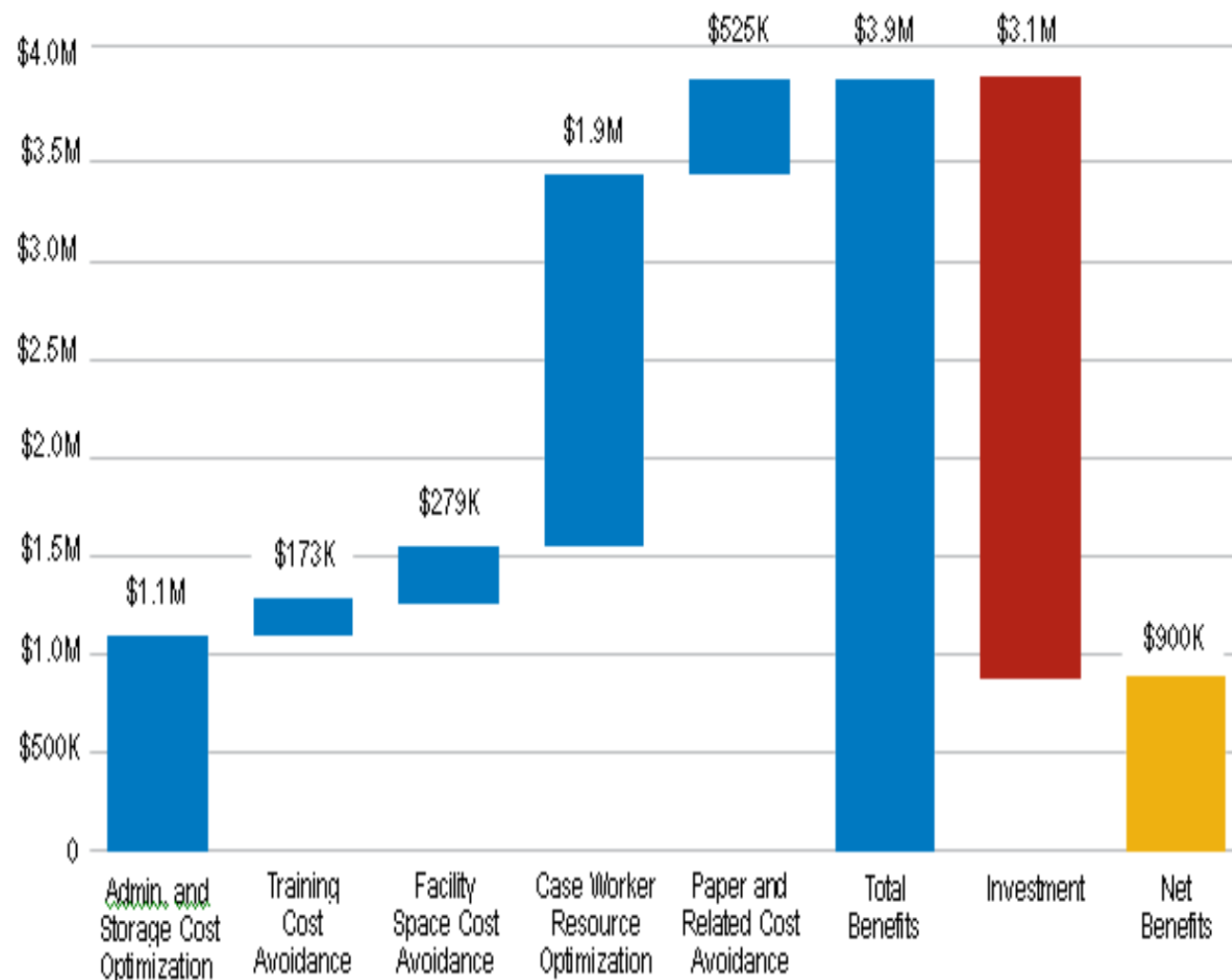
- 29% ROI in first three years

# ECM ROI: Three-Year View

- 
- \$1.1M reduction in records storage costs
    - Reduced record preparation, storage, shredding and disposal costs
  - \$279K facilities space optimization cost avoidance
    - Converted 4,000 sq ft of file cabinet space into staff work areas
  - \$525K in paper-related cost avoidance
    - Less paper purchases and related costs

# ECM Return on Investment

- 
- \$1.9M in labor productivity savings
    - Time-savings in file retrieval (12.8 minutes reduced to 4.6 minutes) will help HSA add 5 fewer caseworkers than service demands would otherwise call for
  - \$172K in staff training cost optimization
    - Streamlined rollout using “super users”
  - \$100K in audit support
    - Easier case access for State auditors

# ECM Future Business Models



ECM lays the foundation for future business models, including

- Electronic work flows
- Mobile worker strategies that position staff in target community locations, making services more uniformly accessible
- Self-serve kiosks
- Integration of other compatible business tools
- Additional automation of paper processes



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
