DISCUSSION

The Health Care Program for Children in Foster Care provides Public Health nurses to facilitate and coordinate well child health and dental care for children in out of home placement. The nurses, in collaboration with the Human Services Agency (HSA) Children and Family Services (CFS) staff and our foster parents, insure these high risk children get the health care they need immediately and on a routine basis in order to identify, treat and prevent further disability. The two PHNs currently in place have more than 700 cases to review every six months and coordinate needed health care as mandated by CFS regulations. The California Department of Health and Human Services has recognized the challenge to perform these activities and has increased its allocation to this program for FY 2012 – 2013 by \$59,829. There are sufficient appropriations in the Public Health adopted budget to cover this position for FY 2012-13.

With the additional nurse, we will be able to increase the ability to monitor each child and be proactive in addressing any health issues, allowing for more comprehensive prevention.
