Award One General Job Order Contract to Perform Facilities Projects Involving the Repair, Maintenance, and Remodeling of Buildings, Structures, or Other Real Property to MTM Construction, Inc in the Amount of \$5,308,500 for a One Year Period or Until Expenditures Reach \$5,308,500, Whichever Occurs First.

RECOMMENDATION:

Award one General Job Order Contract (JOC) to perform facilities projects involving the repair, maintenance, and remodeling of buildings, structures, or other real property to MTM Construction, Inc., City of Industry, California in the amount of \$5,308,500 for a one-year period or until expenditures reach \$5,308,500, whichever occurs first.

DISCUSSION:

The General Services Agency (GSA) has used JOC contracting since 1996 to perform facilities projects involving the repair, maintenance, and remodeling of buildings, structures, or other real property according to unit prices established by specifications for typical work. Individual projects are priced by selecting the proper construction tasks and multiplying them by the correct quantity and appropriate unit price (including the adjustment factor submitted by the low bidder). Each JOC is a competitively bid, firm fixed price, indefinite quantity contract. The primary benefit of JOC contracting is that it provides a contracting vehicle that expedites the processing time for performance of projects funded by the GSA Capital Renewal budget, in addition to GSA-managed projects for other agencies and departments. Additional benefits are:

- Reduces the number of purchase orders and payments processed by GSA and the Auditor-Controller;
- Reduces and/or eliminates potential for change-order claims and architectural/engineering design requirements for small projects;
 and
- JOC Task Orders for each project allow each client agency to readily track budget execution for its budgeted projects in VCFMS.

Your Board is empowered, under Section 20128.5 of the Public Contract Code (Section 20128.5), to award individual annual JOCs of this type that do not exceed \$3,000,000, adjusted to reflect the percentage change in the California Consumer Price Index since 1998. The current calculation adjustment allows for award of a JOC in an amount up to \$5,308,500. Such contracts may not be used for new construction or architectural services.

On January 12, 2022, GSA opened bids for three competitively bid General JOCs. Forty-five contractors requested bid documents during the pre-bid phase. Seven contractors subsequently submitted bids for the three JOCs. GSA recommends this one new JOC be awarded at this time to MTM Construction, Inc., which provided the lowest responsive, responsible bid for this General JOC. A different contractor was the apparent lowest bidder;

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however, that contractor subsequently withdrew their bid. Details of the bidding for this contract are provided in Exhibits 1-A to 1-B.

Your Board's award of this JOC will accommodate current ongoing workload as anticipated for our clients' projects. The term of this contract will be for one year or until expenditures hit the applicable JOC dollar limit, whichever occurs first. JOCs are subject to prevailing wage, and therefore are exempt from the Living Wage Ordinance.
