- Began drafting of ESHA Amendments in 2015-2016
- Planning Commission in August 2018
- Woolsey and Hill Fire Postponed BOS Hearing
- Updates for Dark Skies and State Laws
- Planning Commission in August 2021
- Board of Supervisors October 19, 2021
- Coastal Commission April 6, 2022
- Board of Supervisors July 26, 2022
- Coastal Commission Summer/Fall 2022

Overview of LCP Certification Process

Board of Supervisors Hearing

- Action: BOS Adopts Resolution:
 - Acknowledge receipt of California Coastal Commission (CCC) resolution for certification
 - Accept and agree to all terms or suggested modifications to amendment
 - Agree to issue permits based upon the amended Local Coastal Program

California Coastal Commission Hearing

- Action: CCC Executive Director Determination
 - Determines the Board's action are legally adequate
 - Reports determination to CCC at public meeting
 - Commission accepts or disagrees with determination

CCC Suggested Modifications Overview

Minor Grammatical Corrections/Permit Processing Procedures

Compliance with Coastal Act Policies

- Vegetation removal in fuel modification zones
- Beach maintenance and management

Consistency with Other Jurisdictions

- Outdoor Night Lighting
- Fencing
- In-Lieu Fee Program

Fuel Modification Zones in ESHA

Issue:

New state fire law is not balanced adequately with Coastal Act ESHA protections

CCC Concern:

Applicant can clear ESHA to bare ground up to 10 Acres or 300 feet





Mandatory Fuel Modification Zone (FMZ)

- Required by VCFPD
- State law 100 Feet
- Full Clearance

Expanded Fuel Modification Zone (FMZ)

- Requested by Applicant
- Mandatory FMZ to 300 feet
- Thinning Only

Beach Management and Maintenance Activities

Issue:

Numerous uses, management entities, and various maintenance activities are occurring on Hollywood and Silver Strand Beaches

CCC Concern:

Activities occur without permits and there is a need for a comprehensive management plan for the area











Beach Management and Maintenance Activities

Solution:

- Beach maintenance activities require permits
- Comprehensive beach management plan
- Remove sea level rise analysis requirements

Lighting, Fencing, In-Lieu Fee

Issue:

ESHA and Dark Sky policies and standards are less restrictive than adopted in LA County and City of Malibu Local Coastal Program

CCC Concern:

Ensure consistency across Local Coastal Program ESHA chapters in region

Outdoor Lighting

Solution:

- No lighting of <u>new</u> residential sports courts
- Exempt fixtures less than 60 lumens that are fully shielded and directed downward
- Thresholds for light color temperature and trespass
- Purpose and intent about minimizing light pollution, skyglow and light trespass

Fencing in ESHA

Solution:

 No new perimeter fencing or outside the mandatory fuel modification zone



In-Lieu Fee Program

Solution:

- Interim in-lieu fee CPI inflation adjustment
- Extended interim in-lieu fee expiration date



Recommended Actions
