## RESOLUTION NO. 18-141

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF VENTURA WAIVING CERTAIN PLANNING, BUILDING & SAFETY AND ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH DIVISION FEES RELATED TO THE TEMPORARY DWELLINGS AND REBUILDING OF STRUCTURES DAMAGED OR DESTROYED IN NATURAL DISASTERS

WHEREAS, on December 5, 2017, the Governor of the State of California proclaimed a State of Emergency existed in Ventura County due to the Thomas Fire; and

WHEREAS, on December 5, 2017, the Ventura County Board of Supervisors determined that a local emergency existed in Ventura County and ratified the proclamation of local emergency by the Sheriff of Ventura County, acting as the County Director of Emergency Services; and

WHEREAS, on December 8, 2017, the Ventura County Health Officer and the Ventura County Environmental Health Director declared a local health emergency related to the Thomas Fire and associated fire debris, which the Ventura County Board of Supervisors subsequently ratified; and

WHEREAS, on November 9, 2018, the Lieutenant Governor, serving in the capacity of Acting Governor of the State of California, proclaimed a State of Emergency existed in Ventura County due to the Hill and Woolsey Fires; and

WHEREAS, on November 13, 2018, the Ventura County Board of Supervisors determined that a local emergency existed in Ventura County and ratified the proclamation of local emergency by the Sheriff of Ventura County, acting as the County Director of Emergency Services; and

WHEREAS, on November 9, 2018, the Ventura County Health Officer and the Ventura County Environmental Health Director declared a local health emergency related to the Hill and Woolsey Fires and associated fire debris, which the Ventura County Board of Supervisors subsequently ratified; and

WHEREAS, approximately 600 residential homes have been destroyed or substantially damaged in the unincorporated area of Ventura County, displacing hundreds of county residents from their properties and homes; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interest of those residents displaced by the Thomas, Hill and Woolsey Fires as well as the greater community of Ventura County to begin the disaster recovery process in a timely and efficient manner;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Ventura County Board of Supervisors hereby directs that until December 31, 2020 the following fees be waived for (a) permits for temporary dwellings on properties with structures destroyed or substantially damaged by the Thomas, Hill or Woolsey Fires where the fire debris has been properly disposed of; (b) permits for recreational vehicles occupied by individuals who lost their dwellings in the Thomas, Hill or Woolsey Fires when the recreational vehicles are located on properties not covered by subsection (a) above (if authorized in writing by the property owner); and (c) permits for rebuilding structures destroyed or substantially damaged by the Thomas, Hill or Woolsey Fires that were previously permitted or legally non-conforming and where the fire debris has been properly disposed of:
