Approval of, and Authorization for the Ventura County Public Works Agency Director to Execute, Contract Change Order No. 64 for the Todd Road Jail Health & Programming Unit Project with Sletten Construction Company of Las Vegas, Nevada to Account for Unforeseeable Project Delays for \$2,086,500; Authorization for the Auditor-Controller to Prepare the Necessary Transactions; Specification No. CP18-01; Project No. P6T13401; Supervisorial District No. 3. RECOMMENDATION NO. 2 REQUIRES 4/5THS VOTE

Recommendation:

- 1. Approve, and authorize the Ventura County Public Works Agency Director to execute, Contract Change Order No. 64, attached hereto as "Exhibit 2," to the construction contract with Sletten Construction, Inc. of Las Vegas, Nevada ("Sletten") for the Todd Road Jail Health & Programming Unit project ("Project") to account for unforeseeable project delays and increases in material and labor costs for \$2,086,500.
- 2. Authorize the Auditor-Controller's Office to process the accounting transactions necessary to increase appropriations and revenue as follows: (4/5ths vote required)

Discussion:

The Sheriff's Office, with the approval of your Board, submitted a request for State funding under SB 863 in the amount of \$55,137,000 to the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) to construct a 64-bed facility, hereafter referred to as the Health and Programming Unit (HPU), to house those inmates with medical and mental health special needs. On September 18, 2018, your Board awarded the design-build contract for the Todd Road Jail HPU project to Sletten Construction Company (Sletten).

Sletten's original proposal anticipated permit approvals in August 2019. Actual permit approval was received on July 2, 2021. The extent of these delays could not have been anticipated by Sletten at the time they submitted their proposal.

Further, during this period of delay, cost increases to both labor and materials has been significant and unprecedented. Annual inflation for costs of building construction materials has been over 10 percent. Prevailing wages rates also have increased. Unexpected material and labor shortages have also led to increased costs.

Contract Change Order (CCO) No. 64 will cover a portion of the cost increases that were unforeseen at the time of Sletten's proposal.

Costs for this CCO No. 64 will be covered within the original SB 863 funding amount.





On September 17, 2019, your Board approved various other funding sources for the security electronic controls upgrade inside the existing TRJ facility. At that time, your Board also approved reducing the appropriations in the TRJ Expansion Fund, in an amount of \$2,786,238 for the cost of this work. The Public Works Agency is currently negotiating several change orders with the contractor. The appropriations that were previously removed are needed to encumber CCO 64 and several other new change orders.
