## **Discussion**

We are pleased to announce the graduation of the Tenth Cohort from the County of Ventura's Leadership Excellence and Action Program (LEAP). This program was developed in 2016 with your support and at the direction of, and in collaboration with, the County Executive Office. This program aligns with the County's strategic plan goals to develop "employees to become leaders who promote ethics, innovation, service, accountability and peak performance."

LEAP utilizes nationally recognized gold standards and has local thought leaders as faculty. LEAP primarily targets Agency/Department senior managers and is designed to enhance their effectiveness and to prepare them for advancement. It provides emerging executives an effective skillset designed to enhance the Countywide organizational culture. Specifically, LEAP goals are to:

- Build internal leadership capacity.
- 2. Increase employee accountability.
- 3. Develop self-awareness of leadership competencies and impact on others.
- 4. Maximize employee engagement through coaching.

- 5. Increase political savvy knowledge and skills to expand influence and maximize outcomes.
- 6. Increase presentation skills.
- 7. Build high trust and dependable relationships across agencies and departments.

LEAP is a five-month program with seven days of learning covering 11 content areas. LEAP's essential components include: 1) Real Colors Leadership; 2) 360-Degree Assessment; 3) Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion for Leaders; 4) Employee Coaching; 5) Emotional Intelligence; 6) Employee Engagement 7) Political Savvy 8) Trust; 9) Crucial Accountability; 10) Strategic Leadership; and 11) Mock Board Presentations.

Because the program is customized to meet the needs of the County and facilitated by County and local subject matter experts, it is a highly effective developmental tool, and provides cost savings when compared to similar outsourced programs.
