SUBJECT:

Ratification of the Health Care Agency's Application for a California Department of Public Health (CDPH) COVID-19 Test to Treat Equity Grant to Provide Assistance in COVID-19 Testing and Treatment; Authorization for the Health Care Agency (HCA) Director or Designee to Accept the CDPH Grant Award in the Amount of \$559,091 with an End Date of June 30, 2023; Authorization for the Auditor-Controller to Process the Necessary Accounting Transactions (Recommendation No. 3 Requires 4/5ths Vote).

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- That your Board ratify the Health Care Agency's (HCA) submission of the attached application for a California Department of Public Health (CDPH) COVID-19 Test to Treat Grant to purchase equipment and facilitate the COVID-19 test to treat program.
- 2. That your Board authorize the HCA Director or designee to accept the CDPH, administered by Physicians for a Healthy California (PHC), COVID-19 Test to Treat Equity grant funding in the amount of \$559,091 with an end date of June 30, 2023, pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in the attached Notice of Award.
- 3. That your Board authorize the Auditor-Controller to process the necessary accounting transactions to revise appropriations and unanticipated revenue as follows (Requires 4/5th vote).

REASON FOR RATIFICATION:

The Notice of Funding for the grant was sent on November 10, 2022 with a submission of supplemental information due by November 29, 2022. Due to the short timeframe of the initial submittal, HCA was unable to seek your Board's approval prior to submission.

DISCUSSION:

The Ventura County Health Care Agency (VCHCA) has been committed to providing access to COVID-19 testing, vaccines, and treatment for all patients, including the most vulnerable, since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic. Amid the omicron surge, VCHCA developed a test-to-treat initiative to provide testing and anti-viral medications directly to patients at all primary care clinic sites. With the Test-to-Treat Equity Grant, VCHCA can eliminate barriers to receiving care in communities facing greater impacts of COVID-19.

VCHCA will leverage existing efforts while building community awareness of treatment options with funding available through the grant. VCHCA has identified the need for multiple mobile outreach stations and educational materials in English, Spanish, and Mixteco for county residents. Along with distributing materials, VCHCA will curate social media posts in multiple languages to advertise the importance and availability of COVID-19 therapeutics.

VCHCA will also increase education and services for those experiencing homelessness. Additionally, the grant funding will allow VCHCA to use existing staffing agency contracts for four full-time nurses for six months to staff mobile outreach stations, complete workflow development, and train other staff for smooth and continuous operations after the grant period ends.

The initial funding provided to VCHCA from CDPH and PHC was \$461,000. In partnership with community organizations, VCHCA will connect with the agricultural community, helping farmworkers navigate their access to care. VCHCA has specifically partnered with MICOP, Mixteco Indigena Community Organizing Project, through a CDPH supplemental grant — COVID-19 Treatments Community-Clinical Linkages Grant where CDPH has provided VCHCA with an additional \$98,091 to collaborate with MICOP by providing culturally appropriate outreach to the farmworker community, including community education and advertisements through social media and radio.

The HCA received their notice of award from CDPH in November 2022, but the grant period is back dated from August 1, 2022. The total amount of funding from CDPH and PHC was \$559,091 over the course of eleven (11) months.
